



Brief Biography of the Convocation Speaker

Mr. Matiur Rahman

Editor & Publisher, The Daily Prothom Alo

Matiur Rahman was born in January 2, 1946. Since its inception on 4 November 1998, he is holding the position of Editor of Prothom Alo (First Light). He is also the Publisher of this most circulated daily in Bangladesh. The newspaper's unpartisan and uncompromising stance towards presenting the truth as well as its constructive advocacy and unsparing editorials attracted legions of readers in no time and consequently it became the most trusted and respected newspaper of the country. Under his able stewardship, Prothom Alo has broken all the prevalent circulation, readership and revenue records of the print media industry of Bangladesh and is relentlessly pursuing to take itself into newer heights.

Before launching the daily Prothom Alo, Matiur Rahman worked as the Editor of the weekly Ekota from 1970 to 1991 and the daily Bhorer Kagoj from 1992 to 1998. Matiur Rahman has pursued a vigorous editorial policy of strengthening democracy, freedom of expression and establishing fundamental human rights. His occasional column 'Commentary' has gained tremendous popularity among readers.


He completed his Post Graduation Degree in Statistics from Dhaka University in late 60's. From 1962 to 1969 he was a Central Leader of the left leaning East Pakistan Students' Union - one of the most influential students organisation of the then Pakistan. He was also the General Secretary Sangskriti Sangstha, a cultural organization of the same university from 1965 to 1968. He was later active in leftist politics as a Central Leader of the Communist Party of Bangladesh (CPB) from 1973 to 1990.

In 1991 and 1996 he helped to organize SAARC (South Asian Association for Regional Co-operation) Election Observer Team, which was initiated by Ethnic Study Centre of Sri Lanka and funded by NORAD for the National Parliament Election of Bangladesh. He also became the member of non-governmental SAARC Election Observer Team for Pakistan National Election held in 1997 and 2002. He attended numerous international seminars and conferences in many countries in New York (USA), London (UK), New Delhi (India), Moscow (Russia), Paris (France), Kathmandu (Nepal) and other countries.

He has authored books including Akash Bhora Surjo Tara (The sky is full of sun and stars), 2. Khapra Ward Hottyakando (Killings at Khapra Ward), 3. Kar Rajniti Kisher Rajniti (Whose Politics What Politics), 4. Mukta Gonotantra Ruddho Rajnitee (Free Democracy), 5. Shaheed Noor Hossain (Martyred NurHossain), 6. Itihasher Satya Sandhane (In quest for historical truth) and 7. Dhanik Srenir Lutpater Kahini (The story of looting by the rich). Besides authoring, he has also edited a number of books.

In 2005, he received the Ramon Magsaysay Award for Journalism, Literature and Creative Communication Arts. The foundation recognized his relentless combat against acid violence in creating mass awareness against this crime and building-up funds to help acid burnt women through *Prothom Alo* and Prothom Alo Trust. He was recognised as "the navigator of positive social and cultural change" in Bangladesh for initiating many movements for various social causes.







In 2011, BRAC University became the first university in Bangladesh to attend the Lunabotics event (NASA, USA) and in 2012, their project was ranked the highest among all universities in Asia. Several other universities in Bangladesh now took part in the Lunabotics event, and BRAC University is unanimously identified as the pioneer in this event for Bangladesh.





Department of Mathematics and Natural Sciences

Goals and Objectives

So it was quite natural that the Department of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (MNS) was established as one of the key departments of BRAC University when it started its journey in 2001. MNS Department has been providing quality education in basic and applied sciences to the students of different disciplines of BRACU including its own. The Department offers to the students of other departments courses in physical and life sciences like physics, chemistry, biology, biotechnology, microbiology and also courses in mathematics, statistics, economic geography and environmental sciences.

Achievements

Program

Bachelor of Pharmacy (B. Pharm.)



School of Law (SoL)



Goals and Objectives

Founded in 2004, the School of Law at BRAC University is a gateway through which students are prepared for careers in Law, in administrative services, the judiciary and in the development sector. The four-year undergraduate programme at the School of Law culminates into a Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) degree for successful students. Although the primary emphasis of the programme is on Law and the legal profession, given that Law is also intertwined with economics, development, business and sociology, it also prepares students who are inclined to seek professions in other disciplines.

Recognizing BRAC's background and the goals and commitments of BRAC University, the School of Law endeavours to impart legal education to seek legal solutions that respect the social, cultural and aesthetic needs of the people. To meet this goal, it strives to impart to its students not only the tenets of the Law, but also legal philosophy, rights-based issues and a broader awareness of the society they live in. Graduates from the School of Law are now pursuing careers as lawyers, judges, corporate legal officers, development workers and academics.

In 2004, the School of Law started its journey with six students. To date, there are over 400 students studying Law at BRAC University.





Achievement

The School of Law is noteworthy in the fact that it has both a Law Club and a Moot Court Society, where students are constantly engaged in preparing for moot court competitions, writing research papers and articles for the Law Club newsletter 'Acumen' and planning lecture programmes and social awareness activities. The mooters have been successful in several national and international competitions, including

the prestigious ICRC Henry Dunant Moot Court Competitions. The Law Club is the prineer of court visit programmes, that take Law school seniors to court observation trips twice a year.

The School of Law offers a Bachelor of Law (LL.B.) degree with Honours. Students are expected to complete 135 credits in their four years of undergraduate study, of which 62 credits are Major Law courses.





James P. Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH)



Goals and Objectives

The James P Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH) aims to transform the current system of health delivery through its commitment to contribute to high-quality education and research. Founded in 2004 as the public health wing under BRAC University, the focus of JPGSPH is to provide access to education, research, training and advocacy though integration and innovation. The School uses a multidisciplinary and cutting-edge approach which places experts in the service of society, and train the next generation of global and national health leaders. This practical conversion of knowledge at JPGSPH is applicable in both local and global contexts.

JPGSPH aspires to become a worldwide leader in interdisciplinary global health education by promoting and providing public health, nutrition, midwifery and nursing education and training to harness knowledge and expertise in pursuit of health equity. At the same time, the School catalyses and conducts groundbreaking research based on contemporary global health issues, responding to the changing nature of infectious and viral diseases as well as influencing policy at both the national and global platform through advocacy and evidence sharing.

Achievement

The James P Grant School of Public Health has warranted its capacity to undertake research and advocacy activities on an array of development issues. The School's research endeavours are significantly aided by partnerships with over 70 national and international institutions and organisations, including BRAC University, BRAC and icddr,b. Presently, the JPGSPH team is conducting 23 research studies, including research on health systems, equity, gender, service delivery, nutrition, and human rights. Some of its ongoing research projects include Reachout, Communication for Development, Go4Health, TB Mortality Research, Early Biomarker of Dengue, Creating Universal Health Coverage (UHC) Momentum in Bangladesh: the Challenges and Opportunities, and Food Security and Nutrition Surveillance – NNS.



Developing Midwives Project

Department of Midwifery and Nursing



BRAC University has been implementing the Developing Midwives Project (DMP) since 2012 with a vision to reduce the maternal and neonatal mortality and morbidity in Bangladesh. The project is implementing a three-year Diploma in Midwifery education under the Department of Midwifery and Nursing at seven Academic Sites across the country. This project is funded by the Department for International Development (DFID) of the UK government. The department of Midwifery and Nursing is headed by the Interim Chairperson Dr. Jahir Uddin Ahmed and there are three teams within this department for DMP which are Midwifery Education Team (MET), Project Management Team (PMT) and Monitoring & Evaluation and Communications Team (M&ECT). The Diploma in Midwifery education is approved by the Ministry of Health of Family Welfare of Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh and accredited by the Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery Council (BNMC).

Goals and Purpose

The purpose of the project is to develop a cadre of competent and compassionate midwives who will live and practice in hard-to-reach underserved rural and urban areas of the country. The DMP is designed with a two-pronged approach where first prong is to develop qualified midwives and the second one is to develop faculty for midwifery education. Based upon the development history of Bangladesh, the project is first of its kind in private sector to develop midwives and faculty in the country.

Diploma in Midwifery Education

The Diploma in Midwifery education is being implemented following an innovative 'hub and spokes' model. In this model BRAC University performs as *hub* and seven other Academic Sites perform as *spokes*. Apart

from the urban Academic Site in Dhaka, which is managed by BRAC University directly, other six Academic Sites are in distant rural areas in partnership with six NGOs at five districts in the country. These six Academic Sites are- Friends in Village Development Bangladesh (FIVDB) and Shimantik in Sylhet, Garo-Baptist Convention-Christian Health Project (GBC-CHP) in Mymensingh, Partners in Health and Development (PHD) in Khulna, Lutheran Aid to Medicine in Bangladesh (LAMB) in Dinajpur and Hope Foundation in Cox's Bazar. BRAC University is responsible for overall implementation of Diploma in Midwifery education at these seven Academic Sites.






The Diploma in Midwifery education is a three-year academic programme which follows a competency-based curriculum compliant with the standards of the International Confederation of Midwives (ICM) and the Bangladesh Nursing and Midwifery Council (BNMC). The curriculum of 155 credits consists of 40% theory and 60% practical hours and is divided into six semesters of two per year. The Midwifery Education Team is responsible for developing and timely dissemination of all academic materials. There are 47 modules for this diploma education, including 6 modules on English language which are managed and developed by BRAC Institute of Language (BIL). All the Academic Sites are designed with adequate classrooms, clinical labs, computer labs, libraries and dormitory facilities.

The education is completely residential and BRAC University bears all the costs e.g. tuition fee, education materials, food, accommodation etc. for all students. In addition, every student receives a monthly stipend of BDT 500. At present 404 students are studying the Diploma in Midwifery education in two batches where 179 students are at 6th semester from first batch, 166 students are at 3rd semester from second batch-A and 59 students are at 2nd semester from second batch-B. The department of Midwifery and Nursing, BRAC University believes that the graduated midwives will set a magnificent example for maternal and neonatal health services in the country.

BRAC Institute of Languages (BIL)



Goals and Objectives

BIL's aim is to assist students in developing the language skills they need to become successful in graduate schools and in their professional lives. The institute focuses on implementing student-centred and creative language teaching techniques by developing modules based on students' proficiency level. This not only eliminates the possibility of having mixed ability classes but also ensures small classes with excellent interaction between teachers and learners. Additionally, BIL is committed to the field of academic language teaching and research, with a clear focus on creative and forward thinking teaching concepts for diverse learner groups.

- BRAC Primary School Teacher Training (BPSTT)
- English for Specific Purposes (ESP) courses for different national and international organizations like BRAC, Bureau of Non-Formal Education (BNFE), Regulatory Reform Commission (RRC), Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET), ILO, UNICEF, etc.
- Development of ESP modules for midwifery and nursing students of Bangladesh.

Achievements

Over the last 10 years, BIL has developed and offered unique and dynamic courses and materials catering to the needs of diverse learners and organisations. These are: training for RAI Foundation Scholarship Recipients and a venture with BRAC's STAR project in collaboration with UNICEF and ILO for the English language skills of the outreach students who are currently involved in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET). Together with BRAC, ILO and BMET, BIL has established the language labs with training manuals and audio-visual materials in English-Bangla-Arabic on four trades at two Technical Training Centres (TTCs) for the project titled 'Promoting Decent Work through Improved Migration Policy and its Application in Bangladesh'. Furthermore, BIL has developed six ESP modules for the 'Diploma in Midwifery' course in collaboration with James P Grant School of Public Health (JPGSPH). Other significant achievements include BIL's collaboration with the English in Action project aided by the Open University, UK in their MYTEC program.

Faculty Overview

The strengths that the faculty members of BIL reflect are their interests and work experiences in diverse spheres of academia such as assessment, reflective teaching, peer review, critical and creative thinking, adult teaching, teacher training, experiential learning, English for specific purposes, English for academic purposes, curriculum and syllabus design, material development, education and society, use of literature in language teaching, computer assisted language learning, etc.

BRAC Institute of Governance and Development (BIGD)



The BRAC Institute of Governance and Development (BIGD) (formed through a merger of the Institute of Governance Studies and BRAC Development Institute) at BRAC University is a centre of research and academic excellence. BIGD is devoted to research on the entire range of governance concerns as they relate to development, while also conducting research on a range of development issues centred mainly on Bangladesh. BIGD is also a resource centre for promoting research and creating knowledge in area of governance, economic growth, political economy, urbanisation, gender issues, sustainable development and regional studies.

Research

An important facet of the Institute's core mission is to conduct research on governance and development and to disseminate the findings among the law and policy makers of the country. The Institute has been publishing its annual *The State of Governance in Bangladesh* and *The State of Cities* reports since 2006 and 2012 respectively. The Institute publishes working papers, policy notes and briefs, research reports and books on governance, development and public policy.

BIGD conduct multidisciplinary research under the following clusters:

- 1. Economic Growth and Development

- 3. Politics, Democracy and Governance
- 4. Regional Studies

- Short Courses on Procurement & Supply Chain Management


Other Activities





Residential Semester (RS) of BRAC University



Goals and Objectives

BRAC University's (BRACU) Residential Semester (RS), at its Savar campus, is unique amongst higher education experiences in Bangladesh. The curriculum's intensive programs help to develop rounded individuals whose improved leadership skills, ability to independently face challenges, and proficiency in English will better prepare them to face the challenges of higher education (and eventually give them a competitive edge in the job market). Since the launching of the Residential Semester in 2003, a total of 8,465 students have graduated so far.

Courses and Activities Offered

Amongst the mandatory courses offered, the Bangladesh Studies course endeavours to equip students with factual knowledge and analytical skills that eventually enable them to learn and critically appreciate the history, politics and economy of Bangladesh. Simultaneously, the Ethics and Culture course aims to evaluate and thus bring out the goodness or flaws of voluntary human behaviour in the context of our cultural milieu. The course further includes the evolution of the ideas of morality through ages. In addition to these, English language and other modern language courses are offered in RS; thus contributing to develop the language competency of the students. Among the modern language courses, French and Chinese are offered as credit courses at the elementary level of proficiency.

An integral component of the RS curriculum is the Experiential Learning Activities (ELA) which aim to develop students' social skills. These activities include on and off-campus participation of the students in Social Learning Labs, excursions to Lalbagh Fort and Liberation War Museum, visit to BRAC Programs and extra-curricular activities. These RS activities include Spelling Bee, Wall Magazine, Creative Writing, Field Quiz, Poetry Recitation, Dance, Recycling, Drawing and Sketching, Hydroponic Vegetable Cultivation, Gardening, Script Writing and Film Making, Newspaper Reading and Writing Article, Presentation Skills, Traditional Bengali and English Signing, Chess, Yoga and Meditation, etc. In addition, there are a number of mandatory seminars and workshops conducted by experts in their respective fields.



Faculty Overview

Faculty members in RS are selected based on their academic excellence and individual expertise. Additionally, the faculty members possess expertise and research interest in the areas of history, public administration, good governance, development perspectives, ethical theories and dilemmas, morality and moral virtue, evolution of societal values, etc.

On-Campus Facilities

The major infrastructure of the RS campus includes medical services, psychosocial support and sports facilities. The campus has a resident doctor, a part-time doctor and staff nurses. The university has also made institutional arrangements with Enam Medical College and Hospital, located in Savar, for medical emergencies. Moreover, there is a team of psychosocial counselors assigned to support students on RS campus undergoing any kind of personal or social difficulties. The team also organizes sessions on stress management, managing depression, anger management, exam fear etc. Lastly, Savar campus has the infrastructure for



students who wish to play football, cricket, basketball, table tennis, carom, handball, volleyball, or badminton. All these facilities ensure a better and an exciting stay in RS.





Ayesha Abed Library



The Ayesha Abed Library at BRAC University aims to become a world-class Knowledge Resource Centre and provide innovative new services and a wider collection of books and resources to the teaching, learning and research communities, using latest technological developments of the 21st century. The development, organization and maintenance of archives in multiple locations; access to world class resources; personalized assistance in the use of library and information resources; and instruction on research strategies and tools have made this one of the richest libraries in the country.

Mission

The Library's mission is to provide comprehensive resources and services in support of the research, teaching, and learning needs of the University community.

Vision

Develop a world-class Knowledge Resource Centre and provide innovative new services and collections to the teaching, learning and research communities, using latest technological developments of 21st century.

BRAC University library houses approximately 40,000 printed books in its collection and access to over 64,000 e-books and 51,000 e-journals and databases. The library provides both on-campus and off-campus access facilities to online journals and databases.

Moving toward a next generation library, BRAC University Library has implemented a number of projects using open source software.

BRAC University Library has established a Library Learning Resource Centre (LRC) in order to maximize the use of resources help users gain optimum benefits from information sources and systems. BRAC University Library is regularly conducting information literacy classes for students and faculty members. BRAC University library team assisted a number of private and public universities and institutes directly like Military Institute of Science and Technology (MIST), Khulna University of Engineering and Technology (KUET), Action Aid, Centre for the Rehabilitation of the Paralyzed (CRP), Northern University, Bangladesh Parliament Library and British Council Library, to implement digital library initiatives in Bangladesh as a part of capacity building.

Office of Communications (OoC)



The role of Office of Communications (OoC) is to promote BRAC University's strategic messages to its key stakeholders, which include the campus community, prospective future students and guardians, alumni, donors, business organizations, and media and create positive public responses about the University. It also ensures the free flow of information and strengthening BRAC University's brand positioning.

OoC acts as communications focal and builds bridge between the potential media and University constituents. The office provides quality services in terms of media consultation and coverage, event management, promotional material development, audio-visual documentation, photography and filming supports, VIP protocol, government liaisons and maintaining synergy among the University and BRAC Communications and BRAC Advocacy for Social Change.

OoC maintains effective communication with Chancellor's office, Prime Minister's office, Education Ministry and other relevant ministries, governmental bodies like, University Grants Commission (UGC), Immigration office, Special Branch (SB) of Police and other law enforcement organizations, Board of Investment (BoI), embassies etc. in relations with Convocation, donor liaison, international relations etc.

One of the vital responsibilities of the office is to coordinate with in-house departments and help them to access the official website to highlight their achievements and salient activities. Currently, Office of Communications extends aesthetic support to the Web Team in content development of BRAC University's official social media sites.

The scope of work at Office of Communications applies to BRAC University faculty and staff, and in some cases students and assists in building efficient networking with external individuals or organizations in the areas of

- International relations

- Donor and alumni relations



OoC contributes to the aim of BRAC University's policy of accomplishing its goals of maintaining, developing and implementing the strategic communications, public relations, and branding campaigns. These measures aid to increase public awareness and support the university's programs and activities, as well as enhancing the rapport between the university and its important stakeholders.

Office of Student Affairs (OSA)



The Office of Student Affairs (OSA) offers a wide complement of academic and co-curricular programs to promote the core mission of liberal arts education and student development. Established in July 2013, the OSA houses essential student services and campus resources that provide academic, personal, and professional support to the students, facilitate teaching and learning, and augment university life. The OSA brings together the Counseling Unit, the Teaching and Learning Centre (TLC), the Office of Career Services and Alumni Relations (OCSAR), the Office of Co-curricular Activities (OCA), and the Relationship Management Office (RMO).

Student Advising and Learning Support

The student advising and learning support services are designed to help students become independent and successful learners by improving their study skills and self-confidence, encouraging a positive attitude toward education, and preparing them for lifelong learning. The Student Advising and Learning Services at OSA include the following.

First Year Advising Teams (FYAT)

BRAC University's first year advising program provides integrated services of academic advising that seeks to inform and support new students, monitor academic performance and needs, and guide academic planning during the first year. The FYAT advisers and mentors focus exclusively in those areas of university education and student life that concern all students at the university

Probation Advising and Student Support (PASS)

OSA launched a dedicated program of probation removal and retention efforts in May 2014. The Probation Advising and Student Support (PASS) program offers a range of departmental and general academic support to assist students in removing their probation status and embarking on the path to academic success. The PASS Program includes regular individual advising and small group workshops throughout the semester.

Office of Career Services and Alumni Relations (OCSAR)



Having begun its operation in 2004, the Career Services Office (CSO) is poised to consolidate and expand its range of services for students to ensure their optimal preparedness for professional life after graduation. The CSO is now known as Office of Career Services and Alumni Relations (OCSAR).

The core programs of the OCSAR consists of : a) Career Counseling, b) CV Writing, c) Interview Skills, d) Professional Skills Development Program (PSDP), e) Mock Interview Sessions, f) Career Clinics, g) Individual Advising, h) Internship, i) Workshops and Seminars, j) On-Campus Recruitment Events, k) Job Placements/Work Experience Opportunities, l) Community Service Internship Program (CSIP), m) English Proficiency Campaign across BRAC University, n) Leadership Program, and o) Strengthening and Enhancing the Alumni Association of BRAC University.

All of OCSAR's essential services are continuously reviewed with a view to creating sharp and updated focus on developing the precise skill sets that are important for students to excel in the job market. Furthermore, through workshops and seminars which are organized as an integral part of the OCSAR, students are given a strategic understanding of the employment market and key issues related to the corporate sector in Bangladesh.

The proposed consolidation and expansion of the OCSAR will propel the career services function of BRAC University to national prominence. Through intensive preparatory work on all aspects of resume writing, presentation and interview skills, coupled with one to one advising sessions for every graduating student and a range of other support services and career events, this office is determined to develop OCSAR as the top functioning CSO in the country and one which compares favorably with the best career service centres globally.

OCSAR prioritizes its links with employers who take on our students as interns every semester and often recruit them. OCSAR formalizes their relationship with employers and employer-employee networks to ensure a standardized approach to internships and job placements, so that the rights of students as interns/employees are formally agreed alongside their duties and responsibilities.

Apart from dealing with the core activities (students' development and the Professional Skills Development Program (PSDP), Internship and other placement opportunities, employment opportunities, and strengthening the Alumni Association), OCSAR is also engaged in a range of related strategic activities which are important for students, alumni and the University as a whole.

OCSAR has a new Director along with six full-time core team members and is currently working towards building a strong corporate network which will foster greater relation in order to bridge the gap between industry and academia, catering to both BRACU students and alumni.

Alumni Association of BRAC University (AABRACU)



The newly elected Executive Committee of the Alumni Association of BRAC University was declared on the 26th of April, 2015. Following the historic elections that witnessed the introduction of the first ever electronic voting system, BRACU alumni from 29 countries across the globe participated in this historic event!

The newly elected Executive Committee quickly grasped the opportunity to introduce the long awaited AABRACU ID Card! This was done on an auspicious occasion of an Iftaar Mahfil held on July 4^{th} 2015 on a night that witnessed the highest participation ever in such events in the history of AABRACU. The ID Card is guided by a policy and will allow BRAC University alumni to return to the premises in which they learned their trades. Further benefits of the cards will include special privileges to BRAC University alumni. This will be a continuous process.

Relationship Management Office (RMO)



The Relationship Management Office (RMO) at BRAC University is the primary source of all university-related information and is considered a very essential part of BRAC University as it is committed to the continuous improvement of the students' academic phase at BRAC University. It comprises of Information Desk officers and Student Counselors who are the link up points between BRAC University students, alumni and stakeholders, parents and staffs of BRAC University. Our model for continuous improvement of student learning is based on four repetitive steps: plan-do-check-act.

One of the main responsibilities of the RMO is to manage the Scholarship/Financial Aid Program of BRAC University. BRAC University Scholarship/Financial Aid Program finances students of high ability to study and complete the Undergraduate and Graduate programs at the university. Since 2001, from the inception of BRAC University, it has awarded scholarships and financial support to a substantial number of meritorious and needy students. The University's scholarship and financial aid process is transparent and credible and operates in an effective, timely, fair and impartial manner to all who qualify. The process is designed to attract the highest-quality students from home and abroad.

Additionally, BRAC University provides accommodation to female students who came to study from distant locations, on a need basis. The RMO is in-charge of overall supervision of the BRAC University Female Students' Accommodation. Two full-time female superintendents are directly guided by the RMO.

RMO manages and works closely with student volunteers. Volunteer Services provide a variety of programs to help students as they face challenges. Whether they are looking for a volunteer opportunity on campus, in the city, or around the world, BRAC University helps students connect to groups and organizations who could use their help.

RMO strives to continuously improve upon the comments/suggestions made by students and maintains an open-door policy. RMO organizes the 'Freshman Orientation Program' three times a year, with more than 1000 students and parents in each occasion. The RMO also assists in organizing Vice Chancellor's programs with students in every semester.

Office of Co-curricular Activities (OCA)



BRAC University's mission is to achieve excellence in well-rounded education. The components of any well-rounded education, that is learning, development and identity formation, are interactive and add to each other. The students can experience all of these by participating in cocurricular activities along with regular studies. OCA is always supervising the activities of clubs and forums to make the co-curricular arena of the university vibrant and student oriented.

The OCA emphasizes the wholeness of the university experience through synchronized development of body, mind and spirit. The main objectives of the OCA are to create an environment for students' spontaneous participation in cocurricular activities, create leaders for future, and provide opportunities for community service activities. The OCA provides full support in this respect by supervising, assisting, facilitating, encouraging activities of student clubs and forums.

Clubs and Forums

The co-curricular arena of the university is vibrant and student-oriented. The composition of each club or forum includes teacher/staff advisors and student representatives. Enrolment of members is done during the club fair held each semester. OCA supervises the activities with the help of director, an assistant director and student affairs officers. The auditorium, cafeteria and a planted semi-outdoor space with technical support are used for seminars, workshops, exhibitions, indoor games, competitions, fairs, and cultural activities. A yearly award system has been introduced for the students who have major contribution to the activities as well as for the most active clubs. Annual assessment of the co-curricular activities has been conducted since 2006. University rules have been introduced for participating in the activities without hindering academic performance.

There are 33 student clubs and forums in different categories: Cultures/Films; Debate/Moot; Business/Economics; Heritage/Arts; Social welfare/Community services; International; Entrepreneurial; Subject-related; Sports; Science; Adventure/Environment.


Counseling Unit



Recognizing the importance of mental health support in individuals' development and wellbeing, the Counseling Unit of BRAC University has been offering mental health services since 2002. In response to the growing need for such supports, the unit now includes nine professional counselors who are professionally trained specialists, with the rank of faculty member, and have a wide range of expertise in working with individuals. The counselors provide a wide range of support services both at the Mohakhali and Savar's Residential Campuses. The mission of the Counseling Unit is to offer non biased mental health services and assist in overcoming life's challenges and moving towards positive changes. The core values followed by the counselors are based on the American Counseling Association (ACA) Code of Ethics.

Highlights

The Counseling Unit offers individual, group, pair, and parent counseling sessions for the students, parents, faculty members and staff of BRAC University to assist to deal with life's challenges and move towards self empowerment and autonomy. Up to September, 2015, both in the Mohakhali and Savar's Residential Campuses, this unit provided such services to around five hundred and twenty five clients with total eleven hundred and thirty four sessions. Besides, in the last two semesters, this unit offered twenty two workshops on various psychosocial topics. In addition, the Counseling Unit hosted a seminar to observe World Mental Health Day-2015. This unit facilitated two seminars in 2015 on Awareness on Drug Dependency at Savar's Residential Campus for educating youth about the negative consequences of taking drugs. Besides, to promote and convey the importance of the parent's contribution to the students' success and well being, in 2014, this unit hosted two seminars on Positive Parenting Skills. Moreover, in 2015, the counselors hosted five short sessions on Parenting. In the year 2015, the counselors also worked in close collaboration with other offices and programs inside the university, such as faculty orientations and teaching workshops, student learning workshops, first-year advising programs to provide a multidisciplinary approach to student development and academic success. As extended supports, for the last five years, this unit has been facilitating motivational sessions for the students of the Medhabikash Program and RAI Foundation scholarship recipients under the BRAC Education Program (BEP), BRAC. This unit also published its first and second issue of the Counseling Unit Newsletter. As part of personal and professional development, the counselors take regular intense supervision and training on national and international levels. The counselors work as an integral part of BRAC University's mission to create well-rounded professionals and citizens dedicated to the betterment of society and nation.



Centres









Centre for Climate Change and Environmental Research (C3ER)



Goals and Objective

Since its initiation, BRAC University has conducted researches on climate change induced migration, loss and damage, mainstreaming climate change adaptation in national policies, climate change action plan for development sector initiatives, climate change risk assessment, environmental assessment, climate resilient livelihood proposition, water supply and sanitation, legal and institutional framework for climate change adaptation, etc in direct collaboration with BRAC. Assiduously the center devoured comprehensive coordination from the Syndicate and the Board of Trustees of BRAC University for its numerous accomplishments. The Centre helps create a synergy between BRAC University and BRAC in the field of climate change and other environmental issues. Our vision is crafting sustainable and adaptive solutions for society. Our Mission is to establish as a leading research and academic institution on environmental and climate change issues, develop and disseminate knowledge on climate change adaptation, mitigation, disaster risk reduction and to build a climate resilient society.

The Team Overview

The centre acknowledges the multidisciplinary nature of research on climate change and environment. Therefore, the multi-disciplinary pool of professionals from various disciplines including environmental science, geography, engineering, disaster management, natural resources management, urban and regional planning, economics and business are the key resources of C3ER. Apart from that C3ER brings the multi-disciplinary expertise in disaster management, law, architecture, computation and physical science from different schools of BRAC University, which is one of the comparative advantages for conducting multi-disciplinary research. Professor Ainun Nishat is the Advisor of C3ER; Asst. Professor A S Moniruzzaman Khan is the Director in Charge, and Ms. Roufa Khanum is Coordinator and thirteen other faculty members.



Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED)



Objective

The Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED) was inaugurated in April 2011 under the auspices of BRAC Business School (BBS) as a think tank and capacity development arm which will address various issues related to entrepreneurship development in Bangladesh. As a centre within the jurisdiction of a university, CED was also mandated to offer courses and degree programs on Entrepreneurship.

Achievement

BRAC Business School's Centre for Entrepreneurship Development (CED) is the first of its kind amongst the universities of Bangladesh. In 2014 CED entered its third operational year, and within this short period with various activities it has increased its visibility within the dynamic entrepreneurial community of Bangladesh. Since November 2011 CED has been managing and implementing professional exchange programs for entrepreneurs involving Bangladeshi and US nationals. The exchange programs are run with US Department of State grants and are jointly being managed with University of Oklahoma's (OU) Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication. CED recently hosted a high profile summit jointly with New York University's Stern Business School on the business practices of the Bangladeshi RMG sector.

Presently CED is involved with projects involving capacity development of micro-entrepreneurs, higher education enhancement by starting an entrepreneurship incubation centre and a World Bank project aimed at creating housing for the subaltern people. CED is continually involved in bidding for projects that are marked for entrepreneurship development.

Ongoing Initiative

For the first time a management training program for BRAC International's young executives was completed in Bangladesh. The 'Business and Management' training of these BRAC International executives were completely conducted by CED. This was deemed to be a resounding success and a replicable exercise helping BRAC institutionalize the practice.

Faculty Overview

At the organizational level within BRAC University's framework CED is headed by a dedicated Director and run by a Program Manager. BBS faculty members, academic and administration personnel from other departments, and other resources from BRAC University are committed on a project by project basis when required.

Control & Applications Research Centre (CARC)



Goal and Objectives

The Control and Applications Research Centre has expertise and activities in an area of systems and control engineering. CARC has a strong practical focus to the work, and many of the projects involve close collaboration with industrial organizations. We emphasis upon the application requirements and exercise established theoretical techniques to provide solutions through technological demonstration.

Achievement

CARC projects and researches precisely are concentrated on country's economy and sustainability. Under the Synergy program between BRAC and BRAC University, several departments, centres and institutes are working to serve BRAC. From the Department of EEE, CARC is the only entity that is currently working under the Synergy program. Several projects have been successfully done with BRAC Solar like the solar home system standard qualification testing, performance evaluation of the BRAC Solar PV modules etc.

Besides undertaking research projects, CARC is also focused towards providing the students of BRAC University's Department of EEE, a knowledge of the scopes and opportunities of further studies and research through organizing lectures and seminars where renowned academics, both local and from outside the country, are invited to share their perspective.

Writing Centre



The Writing Centre is a resource for the students, faculty, and staff of BRAC University who are interested in developing their writing skills for assignments, publication, or job-related purposes.

Individuals or small groups can book appointments with our consultants to discuss their writing. Due to high demand, we suggest you make your appointment in advance.

The Writing Centre also works with the university's institutes, schools, departments, centres, and other resources to facilitate the ongoing development of academic writing at the university by providing

workshops and in-class presentations and well as consulting on writing-related issues.

The Writing Centre staff will look at a document at any stage in the writing process as well as review the document after it has received feedback from an instructor or publisher. They assist in identifying strengths and weaknesses as well as make suggestions.

In collaboration with faculty members, students, and staff, we strive to build an engaged and creative environment of pedagogical research and development that fosters innovation and collegiality across the university.

From group events to personalized attention, the TLC encourages and supports measurable effectiveness in faculty and student development, course instruction, assessment, scholarly research and innovation in education technologies.

Mission

The core mission of the centre is to keep the campus community updated with pedagogical developments, coordinate teaching and learning resources, support professional development of faculty and staff, and contribute to successful student learning within a liberal arts tradition.

Ongoing Academic Programs

Faculty Development

The TLC hosts Faculty Orientation Program, Follow-up workshops, Faculty Conversations, Instructional Skills Workshops, individual consultation services and web-based interactive modules to reflect on the current knowledge and practices of effective teaching and these components provide continuous support to faculty members in their efforts to hone teaching skills and instructional efficiency at the early stage of their career path.



Student Development

Recognizing the diverse academic backgrounds, skills, and habits of the students, the TLC introduced a campus-wide program of learning support service in collaboration with other offices, units and departments. To cater to these, the TLC actively engages in the design, facilitation and assessment of student advising and learning programs that foster successful outcomes of student learning. The TLC devised strategy for identifying academically struggling students who have potential for improving their

academic performance. To address these strategies, the TLC offers Academic Skills Workshops on general study skills, emotional health, online resources, tools and library services. Besides these, the TLC also coordinates tutorials in 100-level courses in collaboration with the academic departments as a part of the student learning development initiatives.



Quality Assessment and Research

The assessment and research initiatives are the third major component of TLC activities. In line with its mission to provide innovative and effective support to faculty and students, the center is committed to scholarly research and regular assessments of teaching and learning indicators.

In addition to the above support programs, the TLC also offers support for staff development, and club leadership forums. It also organizes seminars and conference on teaching and learning, Research and Training.



Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) Centre



BRAC University is the one and only affiliate of the Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) (http://www.gdln.org) in Bangladesh and has been so since 2006. The Centre is equipped with air conditioned, soundproofed Video Conferencing and multimedia rooms to facilitate a comfortable learning environment. Around 40 people are able to participate at a time.

The Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) is a partnership of over 120 recognized global institutions (affiliates) in over 80 countries that collaborate in the design of customized learning solutions for individuals and organizations working in education and development. 



Overview

BRAC University Administration plays a crucial role by providing administrative and logistical support to facilitate academic and other related activities of the university.

Core Functions of Administration

The Administration Office has a wide-ranging number of core functions which are integral to the smooth running of the university. Below are some of its core functions and responsibilities:

Office of the Registrar



The Registrar's Office supports the academic mission of the University by providing management and administrative support and assistance to the academic community. This is achieved in accordance with academic policies and procedures established by the Private University Act 2010, rules and regulations formulated by the Ministry of Education, University Grants Commission, the Board of Trustees, Syndicate and Academic Council. The Registrar's Office participates and plays a key role in the review, development and enforcement of the goals and objectives of the University. The Office serves as the repository of faculty information and schedules; course enrollments; course offerings; student records; grades; and degrees conferred. Such records are maintained using information systems and Web-services designed to enable

students, academic advisers, staff, departments and programs to conduct their professional duties in a decentralized environment.

It offers a wide range of academic and administrative services associated with admissions, records, registration, advising, graduation services, academic space management and scheduling for students, faculty, and staff. It is also responsible for the compliance with rules and regulations, policies and the Student Code of Conduct.





The Office is divided into three operating Units:

- 1. The Admission Unit
- 2. The Program and Registration Unit
- 3. The Examination Unit

ADMISSION UNIT

At the outset of BRAC University in 2001, Admission Unit started its activities for student enrollment under Registrar's office. This Unit plays an important role of admission process efficiently. This section fulfills all requirements of students, guardians and visitors regarding admission.



PROGRAM AND REGISTRATION UNIT

The Program and Registration is an important unit of the Registrar's office. This unit is dedicated primarily to the service of faculties and students' through scheduling, registration, planning academic calendar,



reporting as well as assisting the deans, chairpersons, directors and other administrative offices.

The major tasks of this office includes the publication of semester course offerings, class and final examination scheduling and invigilation, classroom allocation for courses and admission test, ad hoc reporting to the management and fulfilling requests for students' information, coordinates university-wide course enrollment and registration using University Student Information System (USIS).

EXAMINATION UNIT

The Examination Unit is responsible for managing and maintaining academic records, and ensuring the integrity of examinations and generating transcripts and certificates. The unit also verifies students' academic records and issues various certificates and letters pertaining to the students' record and academic information.

Examinations are conducted every semester during the period indicated in the academic calendar. The examination time-table are displayed on notice boards and the BRAC University website. The university views academic malpractice seriously and does not condone plagiarism or cheating in examinations. A breach of any rule will render a student liable to disciplinary action which may result in the student's expulsion from the University.





The University has in place standard operating procedures to ensure that examinations are conducted professionally and with integrity. Various security measures and levels of checks are in place for the handling of examination before they are released to students. The examination unit publishes results in every semester. The results and award lists are also presented to the Academic Council for approval.

IT Systems office

BRAC University's IT System Office supports and enhances BRAC University's core mission of education, research, service through the effective management and use of information technology. BRAC University has well equipped Video conferencing centre operated in collaboration with Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) It has two campuses, one in Mohakhali Campus with 6-buildings connected by Optical Fiber backbone and another remote campus,



which is located in Savar connected via Radio Link. In Mohakhali campus there are 67-well decorated Classrooms (Computer, Internet, MMP, OHP, Audio) and 22-well decorated computer LABs.

Human Resources Department



The Human Resources Department (HRD) at BRAC University is committed to attracting, encouraging, developing, and retaining a high- quality workforce to support the university's mission of excellence. It shares the university's dedication to build a culture that respects all of its members and celebrates their diversity and contributions as well as valuing their integrity, creativity and accomplishments.

The HRD is practicing core HR functions towards the goal of human resources development. BRAC University HRD covers the general HR functions: a) recruitment and selection, b) training and development, c) compensation and benefits, and d) performance appraisal. HRD follows the University Grants Commission guidelines to shape its recruitment policy with the objective to recruit talented faculty members and administrative staff. Interviews arranged by HRD include written test, computer test and face-to-face interview specially for recruiting admin staff. We follow separate procedure for recruiting faculty members that include demo classes, panel interviews etc. before the final selection. We try to create a comfortable environment for the candidates. This process of hiring people follows a high standard that increases our organizational strength.

The compensation is also determined with an integrated system. BRAC University has a salary structure approved by the Board of Trustees (BoT). HRD makes an arrangement to disburse salary on time every month with a sophisticated payroll management system. Other benefits are also tailored by HRD according to BRAC University policy.

There are separate human resource policies and procedures for academic and non academic staff. These policies and procedures include all issues pertinent to human resource management at BRAC University. A code of conduct on sexual harassment is in place and followed by all employees working at BRAC University. Another code of conduct is also given to the faculty members at the time of joining. We take an acknowledgment of receiving a copy of sexual harassment policy from all the regular employees during their joining. Due to organizational sensitivity to sexual harassment within the organization or outside the organization, HRD is taking care of the latest sexual harassment policy since August 2010.

We welcome every new employee in friendly manner with an overview of the organization before the formal orientation. We provide an orientation kit to new employees, a form for official ID, a form for computer access and e-mail access. HRD at BRAC University manages biometric attendance system for the admin staff. Employees can see their attendance anytime from anywhere through the web access to their profile. They can also see their earned leave balance as well as their profile information.

Finance and Accounts Department



The BRAC University Finance and Accounts Department operates under the supervision of the Treasurer, who is directly appointed by the Chancellor (President-Government Republic of Bangladesh). The Finance and Accounts Department receives tuition, admission, and other fees from the students as well as research grants from donors. The department makes all types of payments and prepares various reports for the management. These include the Weekly Fund Position Report, Monthly Central Budget Variance Report, Annual Financial Statements, Scholarship Reports, Provident Fund Financial Statements, and Donor Reports as well as reports related to taxation activities in respect to the university and its faculty and staff.

The Finance and Accounts Department also maintains the accounts and finance-related activities of more than 25 donor-funded projects as well as student enrollment and registration, faculty and staff payroll, fixed assets management, cash and cheque management, budget preparation, and budgetary control. The Finance and Accounts Department provides information and various types of analysis and reports to the management and assists in the policy and decision-making process of BRAC University.

Procurement Department



Today different organizations employ various management techniques to carry out the efficient functioning of their departments. Procurement management, a process of identifying and obtaining goods and services, is one such where goods and services are acquired from different suppliers or firms, which helps an organization to save a significant amount of money when purchasing quality goods and services from outside.

Efficient procurement implies a system that is operated in a timely manner with a minimum number of steps/layers while being responsive to the needs of the end user, leading to fulfillment of the organization's goals. BRAC University is required to procure a huge number of goods, equipment, and related services. For that, BRAC University has a separate unit for procurement which has been operating independently since April 2006. As procurement has been increasing in value and volume, the requirement of compliance with global and domestic procurement norms and standards has become important for BRAC University. That is why the department is adapting new strategies on a daily basis and operating under the Procurement Procedure for Goods and Services that was prepared in July 2007.

Moreover, every procurement activity is facilitated through electronic means, i.e. email, fax, and phone. The department is also distributing products or commodities in collaboration with a spacious warehouse where these items are stored.

BRAC University's procurement department is staffed by four professionals with the requisite knowledge and skills to ensure that procurement decisions are made in the best interests of the university and in compliance with the university's policies. The university warehouse is staffed with two people responsible for storing and distributing consumable products and/or commodities to the end users.

The procurement department is dedicated to provide maximum services and is taking initiative in developing advanced software for procurement. The policy is also being reviewed to better fit to the changing needs of BRAC University.

Medical Center



BRAC University Medical Center provides various medical services to its students, faculty and staff. The center is well equipped to provide necessary emergency medical services, advice and referral services to the University community. There are two medical centers: one on the main campus of Mohakhali and the other on the residential campus at Savar. Both the Medical Centers have qualified and professional doctors and nurses.

The Medical Team Organizes awareness programs on different seasonal and common diseases on the university premises such as prevention from winter diseases, summer diseases it also Organizes anti-smoking campaign, Prepared health profiles for freshmen, Provided general health check-ups for newly admitted students as well as students who attended the residential semester and Ensured acceptable standards of Public Health and Sanitation at the university campuses and hostels by collecting drinking



water samples from every building and testing them twice in a month. The microbiological testing was done at the MNS department of BRAC University and icddr, b to ensure WHO-standards of drinking water.
