Annual Report of MNS Department, BRACU 2010

Introduction:

The essence of science is change and development. Science plays a vital role in the development and progress of modern technology, whether it is in physical sciences, biological sciences, medicine, social sciences, engineering, agriculture, business, commerce or management. The Department of Mathematics and Natural Sciences (MNS) at BRAC University has been functioning since 2001, that is right from the start of BRACU's journey. The Department is providing quality education in basic and applied sciences and mathematics to the students of different disciplines, including its own.

Academic Excellence:

The Department of MNS offers courses in physical and life sciences, mathematics, statistics, economic geography and environmental sciences. It started the undergraduate programme for the degree of Bachelor of Science (BS) in Physics in Fall 2005 semester. It needs to be mentioned here that BRACU is the first and perhaps the only private university in Bangladesh to introduce undergraduate programmes in physical sciences. In the last convocation held in 2010, one student got her Bachelor of Science degree in Physics with a second major in Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE). Another student got Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Science and Engineering with a second major in Physics. In the sixth convocation to be held on 7 February 2011, two students are going to get their undergraduate degrees majoring in Physics. Two more students would be graduating in this convocation with their second major in Physics. The MNS Department is also running undergraduate programmes in Applied Physics and Electronics. It offers undergraduate programme in Mathematics as well.

The MNS Department started two new undergraduate programmes from Summer

Semester 2010 in biological sciences. The programmes are Bachelor of Science in biotechnology and Bachelor of Science in microbiology. For these two programmes, necessary lab facilities have been created. There are two separate labs for the biotechnology and microbiology programmes. The labs are well equipped with necessary equipment and accessories to carry out not only the course lab work but also to carry out high quality research. Biotechnology is a multidisciplinary science involving various disciplines like biochemistry, microbiology, molecular biology, genetics, chemical and biochemical engineering. The theory and lab courses for this programme have been designed accordingly. Genetic engineering is the latest branch of molecular biology which has been employed in the progress while making the syllabus. Microbiology programme includes topics such as basic microbiological techniques, biochemistry, microbial biotechnology, food microbiology, fermentation technology, industrial microbiology and so on. Students will get fundamental knowledge, as well as acquire theoretical and practical skills in biotechnology, molecular biology and microbiology through these programmes. They will also be provided with the fundamental knowledge in related physical and biological sciences. The undergraduate programmes in biotechnology and microbiology have been launched to build basic strength in their respective fields which will help prepare the students in pursuing higher studies in these emerging fields. The department also plans to start undergraduate programmes in biotechnology and molecular biology in the near future.

The MNS Department started the MS Biotechnology programme in the Spring 2007 Semester. Four students of the first batch of this programme got their degrees in the fourth convocation held in 2009. Four more students under this programme obtained their MS degrees

in the last convocation held in 2010. In the sixth convocation to be held on 7 February 2011, four students are going to get their MS degree in biotechnology.

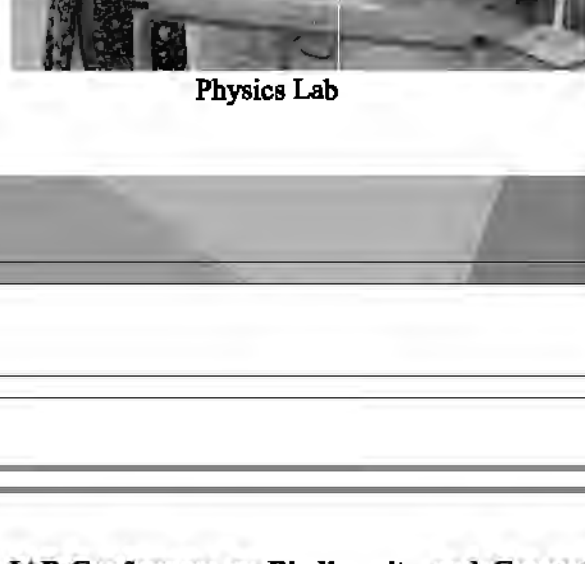

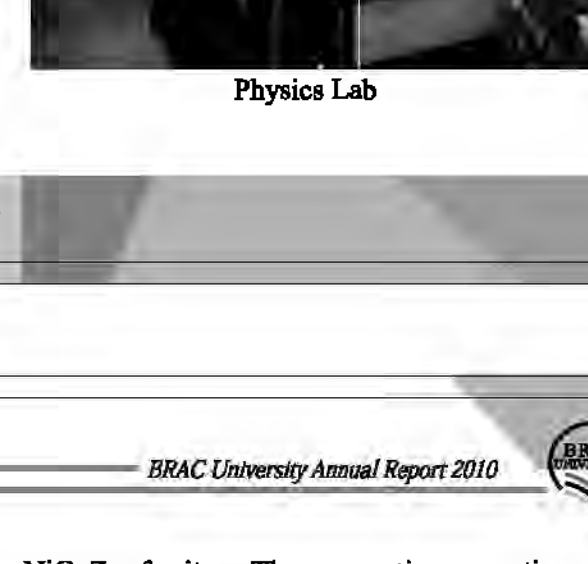

Research Projects:

BAS-USDA-PALS Project

Dr. Aparna Islam, Assistant Professor of Biotechnology Programme, of the MNS Department along with Professor Zohel Seraj of the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, University of Dhaka (DU) were awarded BAS-USDA PALS Endowment Fund for a project titled "Production of tomato tolerant to environmental stresses like salinity". The allocated money for the project is around 58 lacs. The project is an inter-institute cooperation project which will be carried out partly at BRACU and partly at DU under the joint supervision of Dr. Islam (Principal Investigator) and Professor Seraj (Co-Principal Investigator). The proposed project spread over three years includes development of plant tissue culture and molecular biology laboratory facilities at BRACU. Following inception of plant tissue culture lab the regeneration protocol for tomato will be developed. Various factors responsible for transformation efficiency will be evaluated prior to transformation with the salt tolerant gene. The project commenced in October 2010 at BRACU and the lab facilities have already been set up.

Grant for Research in Plasma Fusion and Space Science

A project titled "Development of Glow Discharge Plasma Facilities for Fusion, Space Science and Industrial Applications" with Professor Dr. Mofiz Uddin Ahmed of the Department of MNS as the Principal Investigator has recently been allocated a research grant of Tk. 10,00,000 (Ten Lacs only) by the Ministry of Education, GOB. In this project glow discharge plasma research facilities will be developed for fusion, space science and industrial applications. A glow discharge is a self sustaining discharge, which

normally occurs at pressures well below atmospheric pressure. The positive column in the discharge represents the plasma which is to be studied in the context of fusion, space plasma research and for various possible industrial applications. Processes happening in fusion devices like TOKAMAK, STELLERATORS etc. can easily be investigated with this simple low cost device. Space plasma, ionospheric phenomenon, interaction of electromagnetic waves associated with earthquakes and magnetosphere plasmas, processes in dusty plasmas, will also be investigated through this study.

Conferences:

Annual Botanical Conference 2009, Chittagong, 9-10 January 2010

Dr. Aparna Islam of MNS Department and Ms. Jebrunessa Chowdhury, MS student of Biotechnology participated in the Annual Botanical Conference held in Chittagong on 9-10 January 2009. The Conference was arranged jointly by the Department of Botany, University of Chittagong and Bangladesh Botanical Society. The event took place at the University of Chittagong. Theme of this conference was "Coastal and Marine Plant Resources of Bangladesh: Management and Exploitation". The conference was divided in four technical sessions having themes of biodiversity, mycorrhiza and arsenic pollution, experimental botany, and biotechnology. Ms. Chowdhury presented a research paper entitled "Comparison of Regeneration Frequency of the Locally Grown Tomato (*Lycopersicon esculentum* Miller) Varieties with Commercial Indian Variety". The work presented was part of the MS thesis project of Ms. Chowdhury, carried out under the supervision of Dr. Islam. The conference was attended by plant scientists from all over the

Bangladesh Academy of Sciences in 2005 comprises more than forty research and academic organizations of the country and the consortium subscribes to 35 world renowned journals and supplies more than 20,000 world-class publications to the scientists, teachers, researchers and students of different member organizations. It arranges training courses and offers trouble-shooting advice to different organizations in administration and management of e-resources.

International Conference On Recent Advances In Physics (RAP-2010), Department of Physics, University of Dhaka, March 27-29, 2010

Mr. Md. Kamruzzaman, Teaching Assistant of the MNS Department participated at the above-mentioned International Conference on 27-29 March, 2010 in Dhaka. It was organized by the Department of Physics, University of Dhaka and Materials Science Division, Atomic Energy Centre, Dhaka was held in the Senate Bhavan, University of Dhaka. Mr. Zaman presented a poster entitled "A Model Interpolating Between Regular And Scale Free Network With Tunable Exponent". The paper dealt with the complex networking system and developing a simple network model which emerged as a scale free network without imposing a preferential attachment rule given by Barabasi.

The Daily Star Roundtable Conference (RTC) On Scientific Innovations in Bangladesh: Developing Rapport Between Scientists, Industries and the Media, Dhaka, May 24, 2010

Professor Naiyayum Choudhury was invited by the Daily Star on 24 May, 2010 to participate in the above-mentioned RTC to discuss the ways and means to develop and strengthen rapport between scientists and the users of their research products in business and industry, increase the level of interaction among the scientists and between the scientists and the industry and to

make the public and the policy makers aware of the innovations being made by the scientists in different fields. Twenty participants were invited which included chairmen of research organizations, senior professors of different universities, some young researchers and entrepreneurs. During the Conference, simultaneous scientific sessions were held on climate change and health, culture and health, and technology and health. World-renowned researchers from across the globe were invited to share their experiences and breakthroughs on the aforesaid topics.

National Crops and Forestry Biotechnology Policy Guidelines, Dhaka, 7 April, 2010

Professor Naiyayum Choudhury and Dr. Aparna Islam attended a day-long national workshop on "National Crops and Forestry Biotechnology Policy Guidelines". It was organized by the Ministry of Science and Information & Communication Technology (MOSICT), GOB on 7 April, 2010 at the Bangladeshu NovoTheatre Auditorium, Dhaka. The final draft of the guidelines as presented in the workshop was prepared in line with the National Policy on Biotechnology approved by the government. Participants from different universities, R&D organizations, private enterprises took part in the discussion on the document. Architect Yeasuf Osmán, State Minister, Ministry of Science and ICT, GOB was the Chief Guest of the inaugural ceremony and took part in the discussion as well.

FINAS Foundation Lecture 2010 at the Asiatic Society of Bangladesh, Dhaka, 8 May 2010

Professor Mofiz Uddin Ahmed, of the MNS Department delivered the FINAS Foundation Lecture titled "Plasma Fusion and Space Science" at the Asiatic Society of Bangladesh on 8 May 2010. Professor Ajoy Roy chaired the session and Professor Ahmed A. Jamal, Convener of the Trust Management Committee coordinated the programme. Members of the Foundation, scientists, academics, journalists attended the lecture. The talk was mostly confined to discuss plasma as the fourth state of matter, fusion of the promising and easily available nuclear energy and the space science related to plasma physics. Scientists now believe that 99% of matter in the universe is in plasma state. In the nucleus of all stars a process is happening- called nuclear fusion. In this process light nuclei of hydrogen atoms are fused together to create a heavier nucleus of helium atom. In this nuclear reaction some mass is lost which converts to energy as per Einstein's formula $E=mc^2$. Scientists for the last few decades are trying to control this reaction so that they can release energy from the reaction in a steady way to rotate turbine to generate electricity. This will solve the energy crisis of human beings for hundreds of years as the fuel of this reaction is heavy water which is available in the sea water. On the other hand plasma is the most abundant state of matter in the universe. Pulsars, quasars, black holes all are immersed in matter of plasma state. Prof Mofiz's lecture generated lively discussion among the participants.

MNS Seminar, Dhaka, 10 June, 2010

A seminar entitled "AC Magnetic Characterization of Nanocrystalline Ni_{0.50}-xCuZn_{0.50}Fe₂O₄ prepared by Combustion Technique" was held on Thursday, 10 June 2010, in the Conference Room (UB 1521) of the MNS Department. The seminar was presented by Muhammad Lutfur Rahman of the MNS



Department. The presentation was based on the experimental study of Muhammad Lutfur Rahman for his M. Phil. in Physics from the Bangladesh University of Science and Technology (BUET).

MNS Seminar on Bioethanol Production as Biofuel, Dhaka, 8 July 2010

Mr. Md. Riajul Hossain of the MNS Department, presented a seminar on 8 July 2010 in the MNS Conference Room. The topic of the seminar was "Production of Ethanol Using Yeast Isolates on Water Hyacinth and Azolla". The seminar described the alternative fuel generation by searching alternative cellulosic feedstocks to be used as biomass instead of the existing expensive substrates used for ethanol fermentation. Faculty members from MNS Department and other disciplines were present.

Association of Academies of Sciences in Asia (AASA) International Symposium on 'One Green Asia and the Fourth AASA-FASAS (Federation of Asian Scientific Academies and Societies) Joint International Conference on 'Science Education in Asia and the Pacific', Seoul, South Korea, October 18-22, 2010

At the invitation of the Korean Academy of Science and Technology (KAST), Professor Naiyuum Choudhury participated in the International Symposium on "One Green Asia", organized on the occasion of tenth anniversary of

the AASA and the Fourth ASA-FASAS Joint International Conference on Science Education in Asia and the Pacific. The Conference was held in Seoul, South Korea, on 18-22 October 2010. Professor Choudhury presented a paper on "Climate Change and Biodiversity: Bangladesh Perspective" in the Scientific Session on 19 October, 2010.

AASA currently has a total of 26 member academics representing 26 countries. FASAS currently has 18 member institutions.

Bangladesh JSPS (Japan Society for the Promotion of Science) Alumni Association AGM and Symposium on Climate Change and Biodiversity, BUET, Dhaka, December 21, 2010

The Bangladesh JSPS Alumni Association organized its AGM and 2nd International Symposium on 21 December 2010. The symposium was held at the auditorium of BUET with Dr. Hasan Mahmud, State Minister, Ministry of Environment and Forests, GoB as the Chief Guest. The Alumni Association was formed at the initiative of the JSPS, Tokyo with the objectives of bringing together the JSPS Fellows to share their scientific knowledge and expertise among themselves and also the Japanese scientists under the auspices of the JSPS. The theme of the Symposium was climate change and biodiversity. Bangladesh is one of the vulnerable countries affected every year by natural calamities. Rising sea levels, biodiversity and migrations are the major future problems in Bangladesh. Two keynote papers were presented in the symposium. - Current Status and Future Direction of Wildlife Managements in Japan by Prof. Dr. Yoshihiro Hayashi, Tokyo University of Agriculture, Japan, and Climate Change and Biodiversity- Bangladesh Perspective by Prof. Dr. Naiyuum Choudhury. In the afternoon election of the Executive Council was held and Professor Choudhury was re-elected as President of the Bangladesh JSPS Alumni Association.

Meetings and Visits

Departmental meetings

Seven departmental meetings were held during the reported period. Several academic and administrative issues such as distribution of courses, invigilation duties, attendance, effective teaching practices, residential semester, absence issue, reputation of the department, peer evaluation, tutorial classes, and admission procedure were discussed in the meetings.

Annual General Meeting of National Oceanographic & Maritime Institute (NOAMI) and Election of its Board of Governors

The Annual General Meeting (AGM) of NOAMI was held on Saturday, January 23, 2010 at 4 p.m. at the office of NOAMI with Professor A.A.Z Ahmad in the chair. At the AGM, Professor A.A.Z Ahmad was reelected the Chairman of NOAMI for the fifth consecutive term. Professor Naiyuum Choudhury was elected a Vice Chairman.

Study Tour to Kaptai Hydroelectric Project and Bandarban

Students of the MNS Department went on a study tour to Bandarban and Rangmat on 6-10 January 2010. The team visited Bangladesh's only hydroelectric power project at Kaptai and gathered practical knowledge about the hydroelectric generation. One of the engineers on duty described in details the process of hydro electricity production. The team comprised nine students and it was led by Dr. Mohammad Rafiqul Islam, Assistant Professor in the MNS Department.

18th Meeting of the Executive Committee of the National Committee on Science and Technology (ECNCST), Dhaka, February 2010

The meeting was held on February 2010 at the Ministry of Science and ICT, GOB and chaired

by Architect Yeafesh Osman, State Minister, Ministry of Science and ICT. It may be mentioned that a 51 member National Committee on Science and Technology was formed on 28 July 2009 by the Hon'ble Prime Minister and on the same day the present ECNCST was constituted with 31 Members. Professor Naiyuum Choudhury is a member of the ECNCST.

The meeting discussed the implementation of the decisions of the last ECNCST meeting held on 18 June 2005 including formulation of National Science and Technology Policy, formation of National Science and Technology Foundation, actions taken based on National ICT Policy etc. Professor Choudhury reported the present status of the National Science and Technology Policy. A Review Committee was formed by the Ministry of Science and ICT with Professor Choudhury as Convener to update and modify the National Science and Technology Policy submitted by a Committee in June 2006. Professor Choudhury highlighted some of the revisions and modifications made on the S&T Policy 2006 and proposed that the revised policy document (revised S&T Policy 2010) along with the S&T Policy 2006 be circulated to all the scientific organizations, ministries, NGOs and scientific and professional societies for comments. A one- day workshop would then be organized to deal with all the comments received for incorporation as well as finalization of the National Science and Technology Policy. The meeting accepted the proposal.

Meeting with Sir Fazle Hasan Abed, Chairperson, Governing Board, BRAC University, Dhaka, 15 March, 2010

Professor Golam Samdani Fakir, Acting Vice-Chancellor and Professor A.A.Z.Ahmad, Chairperson, MNS Department met with Sir Fazle Hasan Abed, President, Governing Board, BRACU, on 15 March 2010 to discuss various matters regarding launching of undergraduate programmes in pharmacy, biotechnology and

microbiology. Recruitment of new faculty members and space requirement were also addressed in the meeting.

Visit of Faculty from J.F. Oberlin University, Tokyo, Japan, 14 March 2010

Dr. Yukimasa Tsubota, Professor of Meteorology and Mr. Nobuhiko Kumagai, Assistant Professor of J.F. Oberlin University, Tokyo, Japan met with Professor A.A.Z.Ahmad, Chairperson, MNS Department. They were accompanied by Engineer Tanzeba Ambreen Hq, Programme Manager, Disaster, Environment and Climate Change Programme, BRAC. Professor Ahmad elaborated on the programmes of BRACU in general and those of the MNS Department in particular. They also discussed various possibilities of collaborative research work of mutual interest.

6th Meeting of National Council of Science and Technology, Dhaka, June 27, 2010

The 6th Meeting of the NCST was held in Dhaka at the Meeting Room of the Prime Minister's office, Tejgaon on 27 June 2010. Hon'ble Prime Minister presided over the Meeting. Professor Naiyuum Choudhury, a member of the ECNCST attended the Meeting at the invitation of the Ministry of Science and ICT, GOB. He reported on the present status of the National Science and Technology Policy, 2010, Science and Technology Building and Science and Technology Promotion Trust Fund. He requested that the draft document should be sent to all the members of the NCST for comments, and then a day long workshop would be held with selected participants from the universities, research organizations, NGOs, private sectors, policy makers and news media personnel before finalizing the policy document. The recommendations were approved by the Meeting. Professor Choudhury requested the Hon'ble Prime Minister to permit the MOSICT to start the project on Science and Technology Building. Hon'ble Prime Minister approved the project and told the MOSICT to go ahead with



BRACU MS Biotech Students Visit BCSIR, Dhaka, June 24, 2010

A group of ten MS biotechnology students of BRACU visited BCSIR laboratories on June 24, 2010. The team was led by Md. Riajul Hossain of the MNS Department. She herself demonstrated the production process of various products developed by BCSIR industrial Microbiology Lab, some of which have already been commercialized. A group of seven students of MS Biotechnology programme, visited the Saidabad Water Treatment Plant (SWTP) on 25 July 2010. The group was accompanied by five faculty members, led by Dr. Mahbub Hossain. The SWTP collects water for treatment from two rivers, Shitalakhya and Balu. The group was shown around different steps of water treatment

after collection, addition of chemicals, filtration adjustment of pH etc. before the final potable water is supplied to the zonal distribution channels.

The Saidabad Water Treatment Plant in its Phase II project meets only 30 percent of total demand of water supply, which is 225 million liters per day. DWASA (Dhaka WASA) is furthermore looking into the possibility of increasing the capacity to 450 million liters per day in the third phase of this project. The Executive Engineer told the visiting team that two other water treatment plants were going to be established - Meghna Water Treatment Plant near the River Meghna and a Mawa Water Treatment Plant near the Padma River to meet the increasing demand of water.

Biosafety Core Committee (BCC) Meeting, Dhaka, 4 October, 2010

Professor Naiyuum Choudhury attended the BCC Meeting held on 04 October, 2010 at the Chancellery Conference Room of the Department of Environment. Presided over by Mr. Md. Shahjahan, Director, Technical, DoE, the meeting was attended by Dr. Saharsh Moon Chapotin, Biotechnology Advisor, USAID, Mr. Mak Visoky, Deputy Director, Economic Growth Office, USAID and Dr. Andrew F. Roberts, Deputy Director, Centre for Environmental Risk Assessment (CERA), International Life Science Institute (ILSI), USA and researchers on GMOs from different academic and research institutions of Bangladesh. The meeting discussed the



present status of biosafety in relation to GMOs in the country and different initiatives taken by the Department of Environment to ensure that proper biosafety measures were taken in the laboratory research and field trial of the GMOs. The meeting was informed that the BRRI was conducting protected field trial of golden rice and BARI and a private company were involved in experimental trial of the Bt brinjal.

Commencement of BAS-USDA Funded Project in Agricultural Biotechnology

With Dr Aparna Islam of the MNS Department as the Principal Investigator, and Professor Zeba I. Seraj of the Department of Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, University of Dhaka as the Co-PI, an agricultural project commenced in October 2010. This three year-long agricultural research project is entitled Production of tomato tolerant to environmental stresses like salinity. This inter-institutional collaborative project is funded by the "Bangladesh Academy of Sciences - United States Department of Agriculture Program in Agricultural and Life Sciences (BAS-USDA-PALIS) Endowment Fund for the period 2010-2013. The project has a total allocation of Tk.58,625 lac (Taka Fifty Eight Lac Sixty Two Thousand and Five Hundred only) of which Tk.33,785 lac (Taka Thirty Three Lac Seventy Eight Thousand and Five Hundred only) has been released for the first year (2010-2011).

Stakeholder Consultation for Implementation of National Biosafety Framework, Dhaka, 25 October, 2010

Dr. Aparna Islam of the MNS Department attended a day-long stakeholder consultation meeting on the 'Stock-taking and Project Preparation' towards Implementation of National Biosafety Framework (PINBF). The event was organized by the Department of Environment (DoE), GOB and Global Environment Forum (GEF) in Dhaka, on 25 October, 2010. Various public and private universities and institutions

engaged in biotechnological and GMO research alongside the concerned ministries took part in the meeting.

3rd Meeting of the Biosafety Core Committee, Dhaka, 24 December 2010

Professor Naiyuum Choudhury attended the 3rd Meeting of the Biosafety Core Committee (BCC) of the Department of Environment, GOB held on 24 December 2010 at the Chancellery Hall Room of the DoE. The meeting discussed issues related to field trials of some selected GMOs which included application by a local company named Viola Vitalis for permission for field trial of an arsenic detection kit developed with genetically modified E.coli by the Helmholtz Centre for Environmental Research (UFG), Germany, field trial of late blight resistant transgenic potatoes developed by BARI and Bt brinjal by BARI and a private company. The meeting showed concern about the field trials of the arsenic kit by a local company using GMOs and asked for further information about the facilities available with the company and its linkage with the relevant national laboratories and also about the disposal of the GMO at the field level in remote areas proposed by the company for field trials.

BRAC-BRACU Synergy Meeting

Professor A. A. Ziauddin Ahmad, Professor Naiyuum Choudhury and Dr. Aparna Islam participated in the Brac-BRACU Synergy Meeting held on 20 December 2010 at the Indoor Games Room of BRACU. Professor Ainun Nisat, Vice Chancellor, BRACU was the Chief Guest and Dr. Mahbub Hossain, Executive Director, BRAC was the Special Guest on the occasion. Professor Md. Golam Samdani Fakir, Pro Vice Chancellor moderated the Synergy Meeting. The participants felt that there was ample scope for synergy between BRAC and BRACU in the diversified programmes of BRAC by linking those to the academic programmes at BRACU. It was proposed that good synergy

could be developed between BRAC and MNS in some specific programmes such as agricultural invention of biotechnology.

BRACU TA awarded M.Phil Degree from BUET

The aim of this project was to investigate the factors influencing the production and utilization of hydrogen using anaerobic photosynthetic bacteria, Rhodospirillum rubrum. Hydrogen is a clean and efficient fuel, considered as a potential and more sustainable energy substitute. It has been predicted that the contribution of hydrogen to global energy consumption will increase dramatically, to approximately 50%, and it will possibly become one of the main sources of energy.

MS Biotech Student joined Universite Joseph Fourier, France as a Pre-Doctoral Fellow

B.Sc./Thesis Defence

Nakib Haider Protik and Mohammad Murtaza Mahmud successfully defended their thesis work for the degree of BS in physics on Thursday, March 25, 2010. The event was held in the Conference Room (UB 1521) of the MNS Department. Nakib Haider and Murtaza Mahmud did their thesis work under the supervision of Professor Arshad Momen, Department of Physics, University of Dhaka.

In Nakib Haider's thesis noncommutative geometry has been proposed as an effective method by which physics below the Planck length can be probed. On the other hand, the geometry of the underlying manifold can be probed using the topological field theories proposed by Witten and Schwarz. There exist many topological field theories defined on a variety of noncommutative geometries. In this report, a brief survey of noncommutative geometry is presented along with numerical simulations of the abelian and nonabelian Chern-Simons actions on the noncommutative 2+1 Groenewold-Moyal plane using the Monte Carlo Metropolis algorithm. The implications of the results are also discussed.

Murtaza Mahmud's thesis contained a presentation of his work on Ricci flow and Wormholes in 4D. The idea of Ricci flow is quite general and can also be used for understanding of the evolution of the space-time geometries. These techniques have been used to study the evolution of wormhole geometries of different types. e.g. Morris-Thorne wormholes and wormholes of bubble geometry. Depending upon the initial configuration the wormholes evolve in different ways. In some cases the wormhole throat decreases, pinches off and the manifold is divided into two different asymptotically flat universes. In some other cases the wormhole throat increases and the manifold becomes cylindrical. The evolution of Giddings-Strominger wormhole whose evolutionary process is affected by a spherically symmetric Kalb-Ramond field has also been studied. It is found that its throat increases during the evolutionary process.

MS Thesis Defenses in Biotechnology Programme

Mr. Debashish Paul, Ms. Salma Mir, Mr. Md.

Jahedul Islam and Ms. Sadequa Sultana, MS students in Biotechnology defended their thesis on 16th August 2010. Both Mr. Debashish Paul and Ms. Salma Mir carried out their research work at BIRDEM. They investigated the association of vitamin D and Calpain 10 gene polymorphism in relation to diabetes mellitus in a Bangladeshi population, while Mr. Jahedul Islam worked on protocol development for detection of Salmonella enterica Typhi by nested PCR at ICDDR,B. Sadequa Sultana did her thesis work at Laboratoire Chimie et Biologie des Metaux, CEA Grenoble, France, under a joint collaboration programme between BRAC and CEA-CNRS. She studied the optimization of photoproduction of hydrogen by the bacterium Rhodospirillum rubrum. Through these defenses all four students fulfilled the requirement for their MS degree.

Participation in the Inter-University Mathematics Olympiad

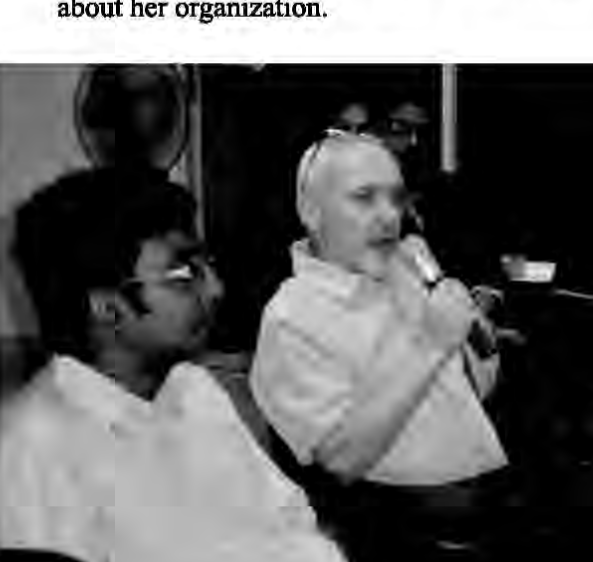


get rid of their shyness. There soon followed volley of questions from the participants which made the session very lively and interactive.

School of Engineering and Computer Science (SECS)

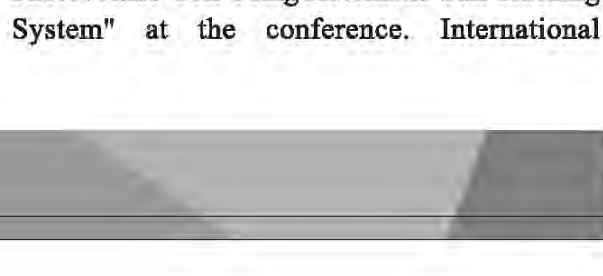


INTRODUCTION

The School of Engineering and Computer Science embodies BRAC University's tradition of excellence as a leader in engineering education and research. The undergraduate and graduate programs offered by this school prepare students to be well-qualified for academia and the industry to apply engineering principles across a wide range of disciplines. The Department of Electrical and Electronic Engineering (EEE) and the Department of Computer Science and Engineering (CSE) synergize and operate together under this school. The EEE Department offers two undergraduate programs: Bachelor of Science in Electrical and Electronic Engineering (BSEEE) and Bachelor of Science in Electronics and Communication Engineering (BSECE), and the CSE Department offers Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS) and Bachelor of Science in Computer Science and Engineering (BSCSE). The School of Engineering and Computer Science has also expanded its curriculum to graduate levels by offering two graduate programs: Master of Science (M. Sc.) in Electrical and Electronic Engineering and Master of Engineering (M. Engg.) in Electrical and Electronic Engineering. Furthermore, the school

is running a training program for CISCO Certified Network Associate (CCNA) under CISCO Networking Academy in BRAC University. Besides academic programs, the School of Engineering and Computer Science highly encourages undergraduate and graduate students to engage in research activities. Under this school, the Center for Research on Bangla Language Processing (CRBLP) was established with support from the PAN Localization Project (PanLin) of the International Development Research Centre (IDRC) of Canada, and subsequent support from Microsoft Corporation. CRBLP is working on Bangla language processing focusing on spelling and grammar checker, search engine, optical character recognition, speech processing, machine translation, and related research areas. For its outstanding contribution to the field of Bangla language processing, CRBLP received the BASIS IT Innovation Search award during SOFTEXPO 2010, and the e-Content and ICT for Development Award 2010 sponsored by the Ministry of Science and ICT. Also in 2010, *Prothom Alo*, the highest circulation newspaper in Bangladesh, launched an audio version of its online newspaper for the visually impaired using Bangla text to speech software developed at

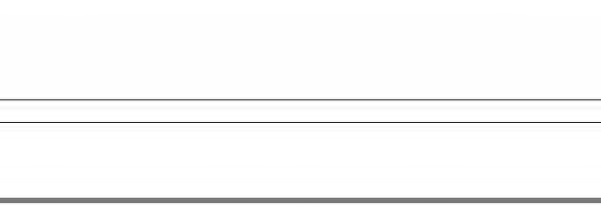
EEE Faculty attended ICREGA'10 conference

Documentary on "When We Left Earth: The NASA Missions"

From the Earth to Universe, the engineers have been showing the courage to conquer them all for the last few decades. And it is been long since they first went beyond the Earth. The greatest ever expedition in human history is documented in "When We Left Earth: The NASA Missions." On 23 June, IEEE BRAC Student Branch organized a technical documentary show based on its 1st episode which is "Part 1: Ordinary Superman". It documented the start of the Space Race and the flight of the Mercury program, including John Glenn's historic flight Friendship 7 and the potentially fatal problem with the heat shield that occurred during the second orbit. The documentary also featured interviews from astronauts as well as NASA officials. The motive of the technical show was to clarify the vagueness of the students regarding NASA's mission and also to encourage the interest of various individuals.

BRACU Faculty and Students attend Seminar on Nanoelectronic Materials

On 20 July 2010 the IEEE student members of BRAC University along with the faculty members attended the seminar on "Nanoelectronic materials and devices for beyond-SI". The main talk was given by M. Abul Khayer of Department of Electrical Engineering, University of California at Riverside, CA, USA. The event, held in BUET, was arranged by IEEE Bangladesh Section, EDS Bangladesh Chapter. The talk stated how to reduce standby power

without compromising device performance, and thereby sustaining Moore's law for post-CMOS. Numerical modeling challenges of the low dimensional structures were also discussed.

USAID funded Research work and seminar

During October 2010 a research team comprising Research Professor Dr. Md. Quamrul Ahsan, Professor Dr. Md. Sayeed Salam, Supriyo Shafkat Ahmed and Radwanul Hasan Siddique conducted research on Transparent Power Transmission Operations and Reliability Regulations (including Grid Code and Pricing Case Studies). Research Professor Dr. Md. Quamrul Ahsan shared the team's research and findings on best practice grid codes, as well as Bangladesh case study recommendations. Professor Dr. Md. Sayeed Salam shared the team's research and findings on best practice power transmission pricing, as well as Bangladesh case study pricing findings utilizing the BERC's published 2008 draft power transmission regulation. The seminar was organized by the Improved Capacity for Energy Access (ICEA) on Transparent Power Transmission Operations & Reliability Regulations (Including Grid Code and Pricing Case Studies). The seminar was held on 14 October 2010 at the Westin, Gulshan, Dhaka. The ICEA is a USAID funded project designed to improve Bangladesh Energy Regulatory Commission's (BERC) and BERC stakeholders' capacity to enable a progressive and beneficial energy regulatory environment in Bangladesh.

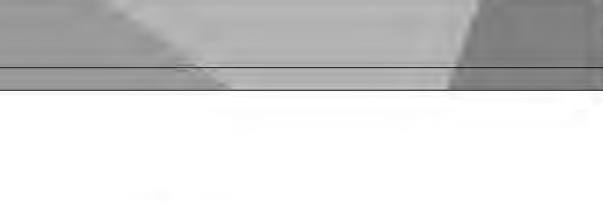

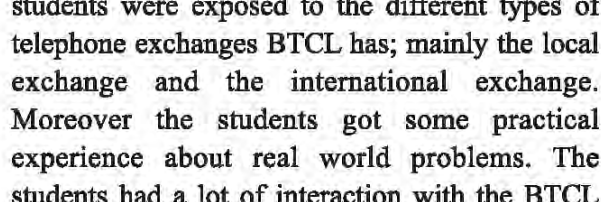
IEEE Technical Tour of Civil Aviation Radar Station and Operations Center

This was the first Technical Tour arranged by IEEE BRAC University Student Branch in 2010. Through spontaneous participation of the IEEE Student Members, the event was a total success. Under the blazing sun of 29 March, IEEE BRAC University Student Branch Members, under the supervision of Faculty members from School of Engineering and Computer Science, BRAC University and a generous co-operation from Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh, organized a technical tour to Hazrat Shahjalal International Airport to study some of the control operations. This technical tour comprised of thirty-six IEEE Student Members and five BRAC University Faculty members. Students were given an idea on the function of Radar system to produce an image of Bangladesh's total air space, showing location of any aircrafts within the country's air territory. The radar data is then provided to the Air Traffic Control Tower constantly interacting with the aircrafts over the country's air space. Students were also shown the Nav Aid System, a control unit placed quite far away from the runway with radial units that had numerous metal receivers attached on them. Under all this was a small room which consisted of the monitoring devices. These devices monitor and provide navigational data to the aircrafts and other control rooms.

Undergraduate students majoring in Computer Science, Electrical, Electronics and Communication fields participated in the display with 8 of their projects. Annual Certificate Awarding Dinner of IEEE Bangladesh Section

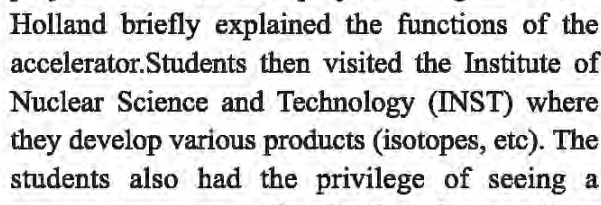

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School of Law BRAC University

The School of Law at BRAC University

Introduction:

Founded in 2004, the School of Law at BRAC University is a gateway through which students are prepared for careers in law, in administrative services, the judiciary and in the development sector. The four year undergraduate programme at the School of Law culminates into a Bachelor of Laws (LL.B.) degree for successful students. Although the primary emphasis of the programme is on law and the legal profession, given that Law is also intertwined with economics, development, business and sociology, it also prepares students who are inclined to seek professions in other disciplines.

The faculties of the School of Law are hand-picked for their academic excellence and individual expertise. They bring with them teaching-learning experiences from Universities in the United Kingdom, Australia, Russia, the United States of America and Bangladesh. The

faculties have individual expertise in the areas of child rights, criminal law, consumer laws, gender studies, business laws, economics, international laws and human rights; all which are shared with the students in course work and in workshops and lecture programmes organised by the School. In 2010, eminent persons such as Mr. Muhammad Zamir, Chief Information Commissioner; Gabriele Derighetti, Deputy Head of Mission of the Embassy of Switzerland; and Mr. Abbas Faiz, Senior Researcher for South Asia, Amnesty International, have given lectures as guests of the School of Law.

The School of Law has a Law Club (with Dr. Saira Rahman Khan as its adviser) and a Moot Court Society (with Dr. Tureen Afroz as its adviser), where students are constantly engaged in preparing for moot court competitions, writing research papers and articles for the Law Club newsletter 'Acumen' and planning lecture programmes and social awareness activities. The mooters have been successful in several national

and international competitions, including the prestigious ICRC Henry Dunant Moot Court Competitions. They are a force to be reckoned with in the national arena. In November 2010, the Moot Court Society published an easy-to-read version of the Constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh – called 'Amader Shonghidhan'. Throughout 2010, the monthly BU Law Club newsletter 'Acumen' has grown to become an interesting and informative fixture within BRAC University.

Recognising BRAC's background and the goals and commitments of BRAC University, the School of Law endeavours to impart legal education to seek legal solutions that respect social, cultural and aesthetic needs of the people. To meet this goal, it strives to impart to its students not only the tenets of the law, but also legal philosophy, rights-based issues and a broader awareness of the society they live in. Graduates from the School of Law are now pursuing careers as lawyers, judges, corporate legal officers, development workers and academics.

The following paragraphs give a brief description of the activities of the faculty members and the students of the School of Law, BRAC University, for 2010.

1. Lectures:

B. Activities of BU Law Club: 2010

The BU Law Club was founded in Fall 2009, the first President being Shaheen Sabon Tiliotoma. Its adviser is Dr. Saira Rahman Khan, Associate Professor, School of Law. The BU Law Club was found on the basis that everyone should be aware of the law and their rights and that students of Law should also be social activists. BU Law Club members have volunteered in human rights organisations, taken part in awareness-raising initiatives and carry out research for short reports in the awareness-raising news letter 'Acumen', which is published every month and distributed throughout the University. Future plans (from 2011) include school visits on the issue of 'rights' and 'child rights', lecture programmes and local level informal discussions. This not only fulfills the objectives of the BU Law Club, but also encourages the members to learn how to utilize their knowledge of law; expand their knowledge base and hone their oratory, organisation and research skills.

The following activities were carried out by the BU Law Club in 2010:

- A lecture on "The Legal Implications of Sexual Harassment" was organized by BU Law Club on Tuesday, 18 February, 2010 at 4 pm in CB 601 in BRAC University. Advocate Fawzia Karim Firoze, Advocate Supreme Court, gave the lecture. She talked about laws and regulations relating to sexual harassment in Bangladesh and recent cases where the Court had laid down guidelines defining 'sexual harassment' and why it was a punishable offence. On 12 March 2010, Abbas Faiz, Senior Researcher, South Asia for Amnesty International gave a talk on "Violence against Women", as a host of the BU Law Club, in CB 602.
- BU Law Club published the first issue of their Newsletter, "Acumen". The Law Club believes that it is everyone's right to know the laws that govern our daily lives and to raise awareness about the

Institute of Educational Development BRAC University (IED-BRACU)

As significant gaps in knowledge and professional development exist in the education sector in Bangladesh, IED-BRACU was established in 2003 under the auspice of BRAC University as a mission to address critical issues surrounding education and development. In particular, IED-BRACU recognizes the need to improve educational quality in order to achieve human developmental goals. Since the Inception Phase in 2005, which was primarily supported by BRAC, IED-BRACU has effectively operated from February 2006 to December 2010 as a beneficiary of joint support from the EKN (Embassy of the Kingdom of Netherlands) and SDC (Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation).

IED conducts its operation through five groups (other than administration). The groups are - Research and Development, Professional Development, Curriculum Development and Research, Academic Program: MED in Educational Leadership, Planning and Management, and Early Childhood Development and Resource Centre.

The research group has been engaged in action research and also doing collaborative research with CREATE (Consortium for Research on Educational Access, Transitions and Equity). Under the action research project, it is working with Registered Non Government Primary Schools (RNGPSs) and students of

secondary level who are either disadvantaged primary school graduates or dropped-out students and unable to attend mainstream secondary school. Another action research project is on inclusive education with National Academy for Educational Management (NAEM), GoB.

The central purpose of the professional development group is to add value to the current capacity development initiative under the Ministry of Primary and Mass Education (MoPME). The two target institutions that this group is working with are the Directorate of Primary Education (DPE) and the National Academy for Primary Education (NAPE).

The curriculum development and research group is directly working with the National Curriculum and Textbook Board (NCTB). The academic group is responsible for offering a Masters in Education in Educational Leadership, Planning and Management. In the first cohort, 15 government Education Officials (five Upazila Education Officers and ten Assistant Upazila Education Officers) out of the total of 21 participants were chosen to attend the one-year intensive MED program, granting them one year's study leave with pay. The government MED participants were awarded a full scholarship which covers their tuition fees and living costs in Dhaka. The second cohort started with 29 participants where 26 are from GoB. ECDRC is offering

May

Based on an online interactive course 'Science of Early Childhood Development' of Red River College (RRC), Canada, a short course on 'Developmental Health and Brain Development' was developed and conducted at ECDRC. International faculty of Red River College and regular faculties of ECDRC facilitated the course.

July

A workshop on 'Child to Child Approaches' was held in collaboration with the Institute of Education, University of London where 24 participants from IED and other national including government and international agencies were present. The facilitator was from the Child to Child Trust, London. The course was organized to build capacity of IED staff by learning about the theoretical aspects of the Child to Child Approach and by being able to translate their theoretical knowledge into practice.

October

- One IED staff received training on emotional learning.
- ECDRC staff received training on research methodologies.

November

15-20 staff participated in a workshop facilitated by Dr. Wilfred J. Perera, National Institute of Education, Sri Lanka November. This was for the group working on RNGPSs.

15-20 staff participated in the Curriculum Workshop facilitated by Professor Robin Alexander, University of Cambridge. The purpose of this was to develop capacities on curriculum review.

Other than the above list, 4 IED staff were given the opportunity to do their masters in 2009 – 2010 and one staff is currently doing an International Professional Doctorate in Education under the University of Sussex.

Field Based Workshops

A total of 7 listening workshops were held with GoB officials, teachers, Head Teachers (HT), Upazila Education Officer (UEO), Assistant Upazila Education Officer (AUEO), madrasa students and education professionals. During this reporting period, a series of 3 educational needs assessment workshops with 67 head teachers of Registered Non-government Primary Schools in remote geographical areas, were carried out to gain a deeper understanding of contextual realities and to reflect upon a comprehensive analysis of locally evolved educational needs in terms of knowledge, skills, attitudes, beliefs, values and performance levels of schools. Building upon these initiatives, another 3 days information needs assessment workshop was organized with 28 head teachers to ensure a "step-by-step" process where participants were expected to articulate and divide all the substantial needs, identified in the previous group assessments, into smaller and specific needs.

Collaboration with DPE

Subir Shukla facilitated an experience sharing workshop on generic training from 18-20 February. This was the first workshop. The main purpose of the generic training was to progressively develop training skills, which include training needs assessment, designing, pre-testing, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. The trainees would then be able to design any form of training for stakeholders within primary education with the support of content knowledge. The first workshop was a combination of a current situation analysis and training needs assessment of the primary education sector. Following the workshop the participants were given practical work, which was presented in the second workshop.

Second experience sharing workshop on Trainers Pool was held from 23-25 April, 2010 where the workshop emphasized designing and conducting training. This was a continuation of the same series facilitated by Subir Shukla. IED personnel, Assistant Thana Education Officers (TEOs) and other representative from GoB from Upazila

Mass Education was the Chief Guest. The discussion was moderated by Dr. Manzoor Ahmed, Senior Advisor at IED-BRACU.

November

MoU with government institutions

May

NAEM and IED entered into an agreement particularly to be the lead partner in carrying out the Action Research on "Inclusive Education in Bangladesh".

Cultural function

After the completion of the MED. course, the first cohort students participated in a cultural program in May 2010. The program included songs, drama and poetry recitation. It was a farewell function for the MED. participants.

Masters of Science (MSc) in Early Childhood Development (ECD), Post Graduate Diploma and Post Graduate Certificate course in ECD.

Capacity development of IED staff, GoB and non government organizations (Training/Workshops, Higher Studies)

Capacity building is an ongoing part of IED's work. Only the major training/workshops (2010) are highlighted below:

January/ February

- ECDRC organized a 7-day accredited short course from 23 - 29 January on child development for the GoB professionals of the Integrated Community Development Project (ICDP). The aim was to contribute in the capacity building activity of the national system. It was a 3 credit and 42 hours course.

- In collaboration with NCTB's Primary Wing a facts-finding workshop with primary teachers and students was held on 28 February, 2010 where 36 students from 35 districts represented the mainstream students as well as the indigenous population of our country. This was organized by the curriculum development and research group of IED.

March

- ECDRC conducted an accredited short course from 21 – 31 March, 2010. A total of 21 participants from NAEM and different NGOs were present at the course. This was done as the capacity building initiative of GoB and other NGOs working in the field of ECD.

- EDU505: 'Principles of Curriculum and the Development of Learning Materials Course' took place at NAEM where in addition to MED students, 12 NAEM staff and faculty were invited to take this course. The course was followed by a field visit to different schools and educational programs in Rangpur. The visit included both mainstream and

alternatives (e.g. BRAC, RDRS, and CARITAS) in order to understand the nature of curriculum and its implementation practice. The field visit experience was later presented through 'Mela'. Through this outreach strategy, IED's relationship with the government bodies working in the field of education has improved significantly and efforts are on-going to build on these relationships in other areas as well.

- EDU 507: 'Leaders as Learners: How Children and Adults Learn'; as part of this course, the first week of sessions took place outside Dhaka at National Academy for Primary Education (NAPE) in Mymensingh, with seven of NAPE faculty and staff participating. This course developed the participants' in-depth understanding of learning and engaged them with new research and thinking about how the brain functions and shapes children and adults' learning and development. The course encouraged the participants to compare different theoretical orientations on learning, explore their own theory of how learning takes place, and integrate theories and research into teaching and management practices.

- An orientation on 'Early Childhood Care and Development program management' was held at Begum Rokeya Conference Hall, RDRS, Rangpur. ECDRC group members facilitated this training program from 13 – 18 March, 2010. This was organized by CAMPE, Bangladesh ECD Network Secretariat, Sub regional Committee of BEN (Rajshahi Region) and RDRS Bangladesh. Twenty four participants from 12 different organizations of BEN network from Rajshahi division participated in the training. The discussion was focused on the early childhood development, child development theory, brain development, developmental domains, importance of play in child development, creativity, role of parents, family members and community etc.

Resource Centers (URCs), Primary Teachers' Training Institute (PTIs), National Academy for Primary Education (NAPE) were present in the workshop.

The third experience sharing workshop by Subir Shukla on Trainers Pool took place during the month of July where the participants were also from the above list and the workshop was focused on preparing a training implementation plan. The fourth experience sharing workshop which was held between September and October focused on developing monitoring, evaluation and reporting system to ensure effectiveness of training. It is to be mentioned that IED submitted a proposal in November 2010 to MoPME for capacity building of Head Teachers and AUEOs through delivery of 10 day short courses. This proposal has been accepted on principle by MoPME. IED plans to involve members of the trainers' pool in the implementation of the short courses.

Dr. Manzoor Ahmed, Senior Advisor participated as a resource person in the Mid-decade World Conference on Education for Sustainable Development, Bonn, Germany from 31 March – 2 April, 2010.

December

- South Asia Regional Conference on Early Childhood Development was held at Bangabandhu International Conference Center, Dhaka from 7-9 December, 2010. Institute of Governance Studies (IGS)



The Institute of Governance Studies (IGS) is a research, training and teaching Institute of BRAC University. For IGS, the concept of governance is best defined as the sum total of the institutions and processes by which society orders and conducts its collective or common affairs. The need for an exclusive institute equipped with recent innovations and practices in public policy and management of the contemporary world for the future leaders of Bangladesh became obvious in the 21st century. BRAC University recognised this need and established the then "Center for Governance Studies" in 2005, which by July 2007 evolved into the 'Institute of Governance Studies' (IGS) as a pioneering Institute in Bangladesh on governance. IGS offers a postgraduate degree - MA in Governance and Development (MAGD), undertakes need based short/professional training and conducts research in areas of governance and development. The annual flagship research publication of IGS - "The State of Governance in Bangladesh" is the first of its kind in the country and has created a unique niche for IGS.

Academic/Short Courses and Other Training MAGD Students Participated in the 5th Convocation 2010

Twenty seven students of the MA in Governance and Development program successfully graduated in the 5th convocation of BRAC University held in February 2010.

IGS Conducted Procurement Training

IGS collaborated with the Chartered Institute of Purchasing and Supply (CIPS), UK to offer CIPS procurement courses in Bangladesh for twenty government officials, sponsored by Central

Procurement Technical Unit (CPTU) of Bangladesh Government. IGS offered courses for Level 4 (Foundation Diploma) and Level 5 (Advanced Diploma) courses in Purchasing and Supply. To build local capacity, CIPS and IGS jointly organised Training of Trainer (ToT) programmes in June and November in 2010. Successful trainers were awarded certificates from CIPS.

Training Course on "Project Management for Development Practitioners"

IGS, in collaboration with BRAC Business School, organised a training course on "Project Management for Development Practitioners" from 17 to 22 July 2010 at JATRI. Thirteen participants attended the course.

Professional Certificate Programme on "Environmental Management and Governance"

IGS started a four-month long Professional Certificate Programme on Environmental Management and Governance in October 2010. The Certificate Programme was offered under 'Building Environmental Governance Capacity in Bangladesh' project, jointly implemented by IGS, North South University, Centre for Natural Resource Studies and University of Manitoba, Canada. The certificate programme aimed to sensitise and build capacity of mid-level officials from public sector, NGOs and private sector on key environmental governance issues related to natural resources and environment management. Twelve participants, mostly from private sector, participated in the Programme.



Civil Service Training Programme on Private Sector Development

The 2nd pilot programme of Civil Service Training Program (CSTP) on Private Sector Development (PSD) was held at BCDM, Rajendrapur (residential phase) and Dhaka (non-residential or experiential learning phase) during 10 - 28 April 2010. The training programme was organised by the IGS in partnership with Bangladesh Enterprise Institute (BEI) and Korea Development Institute (KDI), School of Public Policy and Management, South Korea. The training programme was part of an initiative undertaken by Bangladesh Investment Climate Fund (BICF), in association with the Ministry of Establishment (now Ministry of Public Administration), Government of Bangladesh. Seventeen Deputy Secretaries of the Government of Bangladesh participated in the training programme.

ANSA Refresher Course for MAGD Students

The Affiliated Network for Social Accountability in South Asia Region (ANSA-SAR) and the Global Partnership Fund (GPF) organised a two



days refresher course for the alumni of MA in Governance and Development programme on 29-30 March 2010 at BCDM, Rajendrapur. Fifty five MAGD alumni, who are now currently serving at various levels in the Bangladesh government attended the course.

JATRI Organised Trainings

JATRI organised a number of training courses on different issues in 2010. Topics covered were: Training of Media Trainers Programme in January, a three days training course for the

BDI's mandate is to challenge conventional knowledge and advance a southern voice in the global development discourse. In order to fulfill its mandate, BDI is committed to multi-disciplinarity, not just across academic disciplines, but across its activities in research, teaching and communications. BDI seeks to generate fresh ideas and test new strategies in order to distil good practice lessons for adaptation and scaling up. It provides a space for researchers, policy makers and practitioners to develop new strategic thinking and promote new agendas for social change. In all its work BDI aims to challenge conventional knowledge and generate ideas that foster new approaches to development policy and practice.</p>	<p>2. The postgraduate certificate course on Management of Land Acquisition, Resettlement and Rehabilitation (MLARR) explores issues of land acquisition processes and approaches to resettlement in Bangladesh. The course introduces key concepts, tools and techniques required to effectively acquire land and manage the resettlement process of development induced displaced people. The course runs for the duration of an entire semester, i.e. fourteen weeks. In 2010, eight participants from government and development sectors successfully completed the course. 	<p>and how we fit into the globalised world through an investigation into the roots of our secular culture and our history of struggles for freedom and economic emancipation.</p> <p>Throughout the year 2010, BRAC Development Institute's notable events were:</p> <p>International Conference on Islam and Politics in South Asia</p> <p>BDI conducted a very successful conference titled 'Transcending Binaries: Islam and Politics in South Asia' at BRAC Centre on 18 and 19 December 2010. Besides our own scholars, the conference brought together leading scholars who work on South Asia and Islam from reputed institutions such as Jawaharlal Nehru University, University of California at Berkeley, University of Texas at Austin, University of Amsterdam, Johns Hopkins University, Baltimore, USA, Ryerson University in Toronto and BRAC University.</p> <p>The conference began with an introductory note by Vice Chancellor Professor Ainun Nishat, followed by an opening speech by Chief Guest Dr. Mashiur Rahman, Adviser to the Honorable Prime Minister on Economic Affairs. The conference, organized by BDI and funded by DFID, The World Bank and AusAid, brought together delegates from South Africa, China, Thailand, Argentina, Afghanistan and Colombia who met with Bangladesh government officials, academics and civil society representatives to explore what a national resettlement policy should look like.</p> <p>Pathways of Women's Empowerment Research Programme</p> <p>Pathways of Women's Empowerment Research Programme at BDI is part of an international Research Programme Consortium (RPC) made up of activists and academics who explore and seek to bring about positive changes in women's everyday lives. The researches under this program use the entry points of voice, work and body to determine the processes and conditions that allow women to challenge inequality. The programme investigates what enables women, individually and collectively, to empower themselves, how they sustain these changes, and how development agencies' policies support or hinder this process. UK's Department for International Development primarily funds the program. It hopes to draw students, academics, general readers, women's rights organizations, and other institutions and stakeholders into the various findings, insights and debates related to women's empowerment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A five-day workshop on Digital Story-Telling was organized at Ashika Training Centre in Rangamati from 18-22 April, 2010. 	<p>June, 2010. The panel featured the research on women watching television in Bangladesh. The conference was organized by the Association for Cultural Studies (ACS) and was an excellent forum to highlight the role of culture in development and connect with academics, researchers, practitioners and activists from the Asia-Pacific region.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The book "Mapping Women's Empowerment: Experiences from Bangladesh, India and Pakistan" published jointly by BDI and University Press Limited was launched on 8 July 2010. The volume contains 11 articles by writers from the region discussing the enabling factors and barriers to women's voice, work and bodily integrity and is edited by Professor Firdous Azim and Maheen Sultan. The book is an important resource for activists, educators and anyone interested in issues of equal opportunity, gender discrimination and human rights. <p>The emphasis in 2011 will be in finalising various on-going research and disseminating the findings to various audiences such as academics, media, practitioners and the general public. Various publications will be brought out and a number of public events will be arranged such as a final conference in July 2011. <p>work will be the feeding in of the research outputs into course materials and course design.</p> <p>With the Pathways programme funding coming to a close in September 2011, the international networks established will be formalised and the research work continued through integration into other on-going and planned research in BDI.</p> <p>Urban Poverty</p> <p>The urban poverty research cell at BDI initiated a multi-year, multi-site action research program to test out new ideas and new strategies to address the problems of urban poverty in its more concentrated form – the urban slums. The program, "Building Capacities and Creating Communities: Towards a Multi-Sector Initiative in Urban Slums of Bangladesh," seeks to create sustainable livelihood pathways for the poor, construct a more liveable built environment, provide access to basic services, and develop systems of collaboration and governance that can allow for a more empowering future for slum dwellers in urban Bangladesh. This program is being implemented in association with the Department of Architecture and the School of Public Health at BRAC University, Save the Children (UK), WaterAid Bangladesh and BRAC and other grassroots level organizations.</p> <p>Throughout the year, the action research program has included a range of interventions to address the multidimensional nature of problems that slum dwellers face, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Spatial planning and construction of a more environmentally friendly community • Infrastructure, such as drainage, roads, water supply, street lighting, etc • Access to services, such as health, schooling, finance, etc 	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Housing and tenancy rights • Market development and creation of livelihood opportunities • Effective governance • Insecurity and violence, especially gender violence <p>According to the research proposal, one intervention site and one control site was chosen in each of five slum areas, Khulna, Rajshahi, Mymensingh, Tongi and Dinajpur, where situation analyses and proposed intervention designs were conducted. Following the situation analyses, baseline surveys were conducted in the ten slums. Further, an architect was appointed to construct the physical mapping and architectural mapping of each slum. As stipulated in the research proposal, intervention programs will be implemented in each of the five intervention sites for two years (2011 – 2012). During this period, the Process Documentation Research will be held, in which best practices and policy gaps will be highlighted.</p> <p>Revisiting Devaluation of Daughters in Bangladesh: Continuity or Change?</p> <p>"Revisiting devaluation of daughters in Bangladesh: Continuity or Change?" research is an 18-month research project funded by IDRC.</p> <p>The phenomenon of 'missing women' has been described as one of the less noticed human catastrophes in the world today. However, while absolute numbers of 'missing women' have continued to increase with the increase in population size, there has been a decline in the percentages of women missing, suggesting a reduction in female disadvantage relative to male. Overall sex ratios (males per 100 females) have fallen in most regions but more</p>

<p>substantially in some than others. Progress in the South Asian region has also been uneven, with Bangladesh showing relatively greater improvement in sex ratios compared to India and Pakistan. The aim of the 18-month research titled 'Revisiting devaluation of daughters in Bangladesh: Continuity or Change?' is to use a micro-level and in-depth approach to uncover what the combination of factors might have been that has caused a relatively greater improvement in the sex ratios in Bangladesh compared to her South Asian neighbours, despite far greater poverty. The project is funded by IDRC and research commenced in January 2010.</p> <p>There is a theoretical rationale for this objective: it will provide us with a better grasp of the gender dynamics of social change, particularly change that appears to promote more egalitarian gender relations. There is also a policy rationale: a better grasp of the dynamics of change which lead to a greater investment in the survival and well-being of daughters may provide us with new policy levers to promote such change in other parts of the sub-continent. The following activities were undertaken in 2010:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Household census of data of one village collected and data entry and data cleaning done. • Preliminary analysis of quantitative data done. • In-depth qualitative research completed and sixty two interviews of men and women have been transcribed and translated. • Preliminary qualitative analysis has begun. <p>Citizenship Research</p> <p>The 'Deepening Democracy, Building Citizenship and Promoting Participation'</p>	
	<p>research, better known as the Citizenship research completed its final year of research in 2010. The Bangladesh Citizenship research together with a larger consortium of partners from eight Southern countries is part of the Development Research Centre (DRC) on Citizenship, Participation and Accountability, located at the Institute of Development Studies (IDS), University of Sussex. The DRC was established with DFID funding in 2000 and has been conducting research on citizenship for the last ten years.</p> <p>Taking a 'seeing like a citizen' perspective, the Citizenship DRC has explored a number of themes related to how poor people in different countries understand their roles and identities as citizens; the spaces and dynamics through which they engage and participate to articulate their interests, the new relationships of accountability that emerge between non-state actors, the state and the market as citizens mobilize to claim their rights; and the relationship of citizenship to issues of science, technology and policy.</p> <p>The ten year research period was divided into four phases. The Bangladesh research focused on the struggle for women's rights, collective action at the grassroots, rights of garment workers and community interventions for health rights at the various phases of the research. They are doing so by participating in local committees and arbitration processes, by strengthening engagement with the local government and elected representative and by mobilizing protests. Centre for Languages (CfL)

Introduction

With a clear focus on creative and forward thinking teaching concepts, the Centre for Languages (CfL) of BRAC University is firmly involved in the field of language teaching where there are diverse learner groups including the regular students of BRAC University. The primary goal of the centre is to assist the students in developing the language skills to be successful in their academic, professional and personal life. CfL does this in individual proficiency based courses, formerly known as modules, by using student centered and creative language teaching techniques. This approach has already been proven not only for eliminating the possibility of having mixed ability classes, where some students flourish and some fail, but also in ensuring excellent interaction between teachers and learners within small classes. In addition to the university classes, CfL also offers a pre-university course for the students who need extra help with their English language skills to be successful university students.

BPS Teacher Training Programme

CfL is piloting a 12 week long "Teachers' Training Program" for the teachers working at BRAC Primary Schools (BPS). The programme has four phases. CfL has signed a MOU with BRAC Education Programme (BEP) which states the training objectives: to improve communication skills in English language in the classroom and to develop teaching delivery improvement in English classes. CfL has already completed the needs analysis of fifteen schools and held two workshops with approximately fifty teachers from these schools.

Basic Communication and Teaching Methodologies for Monitors of PACE

The course aims to develop the skills of PACE

(Post primary Basic and Continuing Education, BRAC) monitors. It provides support in the areas of speaking, listening, reading, writing, grammar and also language teaching methodologies. Here, participants are prepared so that they can apply their basic knowledge using correct grammar structures, syntax and language features of selected models and demonstrate ideas in spoken and written forms. Furthermore, the training enables them to gain confidence and competence in evaluating language teaching at the secondary school level and be able to give constructive feedback. The duration of the course is 6 weeks. The training has five stages: Basic Language Learning, Effective Monitoring and Evaluation Strategies, Supplementary Materials Development to support the books approved by NCTB, Classroom Teaching, and Workshop on Teaching Methodologies.

Academic English Course for BRAC University Institute of Educational Development (IED) Students

This Grammar and Technical Writing Course aims to provide a detailed exposure to academic writing stressing on required grammatical tools and allows the participants, doing a masters or a diploma courses in Education, adequate practice on technical writing. An emphasis is given on the application of rules of grammar and syntax to improve writing effectiveness, aptitude and flow. In addition, the techniques of writing as a process are integrated with sufficient practice. The first group participants were the IED staff followed by the students of ECD (Early Childhood and Development) of IED whose English language skills were not up to the mark to start the ECD course right way. CfL has also conducted the Academic English course for government officials in collaboration with Institute of Governance Studies (IGS), BRAC University. The key areas of the course were Academic

in the working or academic environment. The course provides support for the learners who need to develop their basic competence in English language for communication. The course aims to develop writing skills, which include things like writing personal letters and filling in forms; reading skills, which help the learners to comprehend the messages from advertisements and instructions; speaking and listening skills, with emphasis on awareness of cultural influences on communication. Students also practice a range of study and organizational skills required for independent learning and working in an English speaking environment.

Short Language Programmes

A one-week induction training course was conducted for Young Professional Programme (YPP), Batch 3 from 9th – 26th October, 2010. The course contents covered important areas of Development Studies, Business Communication, English Language and Computer Skills. The participants under the program were the new recruits of BRAC being groomed for mid-level positions.



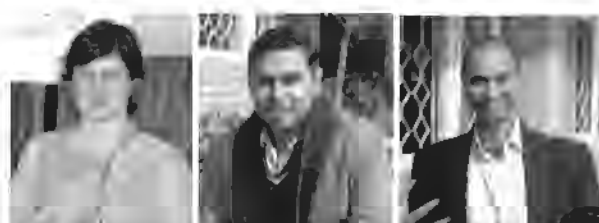

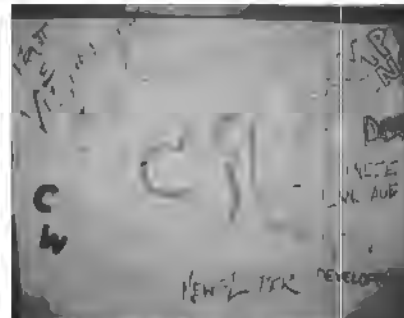
Celebrations

Research and Publications

The following are the updates of CfL for the Academic year 2010:

- BU CfL and Steven Salchak, Assistant Professor of Writing at the George Washington University (GWU) are offering ENG 103 course. This is a collaborative effort to teaching a project initiated by Professor Salchak. Through this approach, students in CfL's ENG103: Advanced Writing and Presentation course and Prof. Salchak's writing course (under GWU's Women's Leadership Program) have the opportunity to work together. Throughout the semester, students will discuss shared readings; co-write articles based on these readings; develop ideas for research papers; and, provide peer feedback. The objective of the partnership between BRACU and GWU students is to create an opportunity for the students to participate in a larger discourse



community. Through correspondence and collaboration, students will broaden their perspectives of themselves, the world, and their place in the world.

- CfL successfully collaborated with BRAC Education Programme (BEP) and completed the Pilot Phase of BRAC Primary School Teachers' Training. The training program was designed to improve the quality of English language skills of BRAC Primary School Teachers (BPS) working for the underprivileged children.
- CfL has successfully led the extracurricular and co-curricular activities for the students attending BRACU Residential Semester in Saver for the Academic year 2010. Throughout the semester, the CfL faculty members facilitated and supervised various activities which equip the students with creative skills. Moreover, three weekends are exclusively allotted for CfL activities every semester. The activities in which students were always enthusiastically involved were: Creative Writing Workshop, Drama, Debate, Quiz competition, Jewellery-making, Spelling Bee, Wall Magazine, Vegetables and Fruit Carving, and Chinese Language.
- Farah Jabeen's article Fantasy and Jonsonian masque was published in Special Issue of BRAC University Journal from the Department of English and Humanities.

English in Action (EIA)

CfL has started working in English in Action (EIA), a British Government funded English language improvement project in Bangladesh, in collaboration with the Open University, UK (OU). The core responsibility of the centre in this project is to assess teachers' progress while participating in the Make Your Teaching Experience Count (MYTEC), a certificate course offered by OU, Under EIA.

EIA aims to provide the opportunity of communicative English teaching/ learning to more than 25 million Bangladeshi teachers and students to change their lives so that they can make better contributions to the economic growth of the country. Therefore, EIA is conducting training and providing support to teachers so that they can understand the new technologies, their usage in the classroom and be able to prepare innovative materials in such a way that they can indeed lead to improved teaching practices. All these methods introduced here follow the Government of Bangladesh's school curriculum, school textbooks and assessment procedures.

After receiving the initial training from the OU, CfL faculty members are now attending MYTEC cluster meetings at different venues around Bangladesh, giving assignments to the trainee teachers on Reflective Teaching, evaluating their written work and providing feedback in various ways such as in writing, over telephone and in person.

Modern Languages

Considering the global expansion of business and growing demand from BRAC University students and people from all walks of life, CfL has been offering courses in a number of foreign languages, such as English, Chinese, French, Spanish, Japanese, Russian, and of course, Bangla. The Centre's learners include students who need a foreign language for successful admission to a graduate program, and adults who need a foreign language to be successful in the global economy. CfL hopes to assist expatriates living in Dhaka, who need to or would like to learn Bangla. This is also noteworthy that the foreign language classes are held during the day for the BRAC university students and those in the evening are designed to accommodate working participants/learners.

Chinese

Language is the most important aspect of communication. It is the main step to understand people and other's culture across the boundaries. Considering the global expansion of business and growing demand from people, CfL has started focusing on specific languages. Because of the expansion of China's economic globalization it is now very important to learn Chinese language. As a result students, businessman, travelers have been showing interest to learn Chinese language. CfL has the most qualified faculty members to teach Chinese language and culture.

CfL offers the following types of courses:

Three months basic Chinese course for beginners (40 hours)

Six month's long business Chinese courses (75 hours)

One year long certificate course

The courses are conducted by Mr. Rahim, and by Mr. Qilong, Chinese language teachers of CfL.

Afghan Education Management Development Programme

In partnership with BRAC Training Division, CfL has extended its help for Afghan Education Management Development Programme. The core aim of this programme is to support BRAC Training Division to elaborate its education development facility at the international level especially with the basic language part. It is indeed an honour for the centre to help BRAC for its international development wings. In its first phase, CfL provided English training to a group of 20 professionals from the Ministry of Education, Afghanistan. Besides, CfL successfully completed a pilot course between August and September 2008 in Afghanistan with officers working for BRAC, Afghanistan. The key areas of this course are Basic Language Skills, Effective Communication Skills and Cross Cultural Communication.

The English Language Course for Bank Executives:

This course provides information and instruction to Bank executives to gain a better understanding of English to be able to communicate within their respective office arena. It enables learners to demonstrate skills in speaking, listening, reading and writing, and also helps understand the corporate culture. The learners are supported as they learn to communicate in social and academic situations using English. They are introduced to new types of academic texts and assessments as well as skills relevant to learners' current professional context.

IELTS (International English Language Testing System)

CfL is conducting a preparatory course of IELTS, which is an internationally recognized language

requirement for higher education, particularly for universities in Britain, Australia and New Zealand. Through this course, CfL provides students an extensive practice of four language skills tested in the IELTS examination and develops knowledge and techniques required to get a high band score. The course introduces the format of the IELTS examination developing students' ability to use the four skills through extensive support of tutoring and assessment.



Medhabikash

Centre for Languages also strives for the welfare of the community. With this aim, it works with Medhabikash, a philanthropic endeavor of BEP (BRAC Education Programme) to promote poor, meritorious GPA 5 holders at SSC and undergraduate level. CfL provides quality education and life skills (Basic English and IT) through three weeks intensive training along with the social skill development with some commendable initiatives like study tour, staying in touch with BRAC University students and other co curricular activities. Here, the motto is to make a difference in the lives of underprivileged children and to develop compassion to share and care. CfL has also successfully trained the BRACU students to conduct classes in English for Medhabikash students.

EPDC (English Proficiency Development Course) is another endeavour of Centre for Languages. This course is developed for those who need the basic communication competence

maintain social etiquettes. Some videos on both European and American styles of dining were also shown to acquaint students with basic dining etiquettes in formal situations.

Faculty Members Participate in an International Conference in Nepal

Lisa Ponjetti, an English Language Fellow, and two other faculty members of CfL, Md. Golam Jamil and Sanjoy Banerjee, participated in the 15th International English Language Conference organized by Nepal English Language Teachers' Association (NELTA) from 19 to 21 February 2010 in Katmandu, Nepal. The focus of the conference was 'English in Diversity' and participants from more than fifteen countries joined there.

Lisa Ponjetti conducted two workshops: 'Using Legos to Explore the Learning Experience' and 'Multilevel Classroom: Can the Students Take Control?' Md. Golam Jamil and Sanjoy Banerjee presented two research papers titled 'A Humanistic Approach to Teaching Academic Writing: Learning from BRAC University' and 'Developing Speaking Skills in English through Community Service: EFL/ESL Perspective' respectively.

Awards and achievements

- S. M. Anwaruddin, a CfL Lecturer, has been awarded TFL scholarship to study Master of Education in Curriculum and Instruction at Loyola University, Chicago, USA, for two years. Training Future Leaders (TFL) is sponsored by the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) and provides a full scholarship for qualified, elite emerging leaders from the Near East and Asia to pursue a Master's Degree in the US in various fields of study.

- Reeham Chowdhury, a Teaching Assistant at the Centre for Languages (CfL), has received a full scholarship to study Master of Applied Linguistics at Huazhong Normal University in China.

- Md. Golam Jamil has returned to CfL BRACU after successfully completing his M.Lit. in English Language Teaching (ELT) programme at the University of St. Andrews, Scotland. As a part of the degree requirements, he attended one semester at the Centre for Research and Foreign Language Education (CRFLE) at Beijing Foreign Studies University (BFSU), China and was involved in teaching to the secondary school students, studying linguistics and assisting some on-going research activities.

- Liza Reshmin, Lecturer II, participated in the 43rd Annual TESOL Convention held from March 26-28, 2009 in Denver, Colorado, USA. She was selected by BRACU CfL to take part in that conference. - CfL has joined in strategic partnerships with international and local partners and is currently working in two programs, MYTEC (Make your Teaching Experience Count), which is a part of the nine year English in Action (EIA) Project, and EIS (English in Schools), both of which aim to improve the English standard of learners of different levels across Bangladesh. The partners of the EIA project are DFID – UK Department for International Development, BBC World Service Trust, BMB Mott MacDonald (the Netherlands), OU – Open University UK, UCEP – Underprivileged Children's

He earned his M.A degree from Dhaka University in Linguistics in 1996 and later obtained B.A. in Chinese Language and Culture (2002) and M.A. in International Relations (2006) from Beijing Language University of China. Prior to his joining BU CfL, he worked in the United Kingdom as an interpreter of Chinese language in a multinational financial service agency.



Educational Projects

Mentoring Program Launched

CfL has launched a Mentoring Program for the Pre-University Students. In this program, classes

will be divided into several groups with a responsible group leader. Each group will get an opportunity to discuss problems related to their study. Facilitators will supervise the group activity twice a week and address the learners' problems instantly. It has adopted the idea of Mentoring Program from BRAC Post Primary Basic and Continuing Education (PACE) with the aim to developing active, independent and learning-oriented students. Pankaj Paul, CfL faculty member, who attended a mentoring workshop arranged by BRAC PACE, is now facilitating the Pre-University Mentoring agenda.

CFPR English Training

English Training for the development managers of the "Challenging the Frontiers of Poverty Reduction" (CFPR) programme of BRAC is a specially designed Functional English course. The core objectives of the course are to prepare learners with essential conversational skills in English to function effectively in real life communication with an emphasis on professional activities. As the participants of this course have to face donors, international visitors and experts, the course also tries to create an opportunity to be aware of social/ business etiquettes and to get exposure to native English language through audio-visual media.

The major language functions that the participants are expected to perform after attending the course are:

- to greet , offer and request
- to describe and compare events, programmes, places and people
- to ask and respond questions correctly
- to give instructions, directions
- to advise

Student Affairs

BRAC University's mission is to achieve excellence in all rounded education. The components of all around education, i.e., learning, development and identify formation are interactive and add to each other. The students can experience all of these through participating in co-curricular activities along with regular studies. University's Student Affairs (SA) provides full support in this respect by supervising activities of student clubs and forums.

Clubs and Forums

The co-curricular arena of the university is quite vibrant and student-oriented. The composition of each club or forum includes teacher/staff advisors and student representatives. Enrolment of members is done during the club fair held each semester. The Director of the Student Affairs supervises the activities with the help of an assistant director and a student affairs officer. A multiuse hall, two eighty-seat lecture halls, cafeteria and a planted semi-outdoor space with technical support are used for seminars, workshop, exhibitions, indoor games, competitions, fairs and cultural activities. The BRACU residential campus in Savar provides a play field for outdoor games. The facilities of BRACU throughout the country such as training centers with dormitories, transport and guides are available for tours and other events.

A yearly award system has been introduced for the students with major contribution as well as for the most active clubs. The SA has currently adopted the "Ambassador Program", where students good in leadership, time management, collaboration & teamwork are selected from clubs and forums and trained to represent the university.

Annual assessment of the co-curriculum activities has been conducted since 2006. University rules have been introduced for participating in the activities without hindering academic performance.

The Student Affairs emphasizes on the wholeness of university experience through synchronized development of body, mind and spirit. It aims at integrating co-curricular with academic learning, and stresses on service learning through community volunteer work.

South Asian Universities Youth Festival- SAUFEST 5

SAUFEST or the South Asian Universities Youth Festival is an annual event initiated and coordinated by the Association of Indian Universities, and is usually hosted by a university in a South Asian country. The main objective of this festival is to enrich the minds of the students of the participating universities through cultural exchange; this also helps in strengthening the bonds of friendship among them and thus among the future generation of leaders in participating countries.

BRAC University Student Affairs organized the 5th South Asian Universities Youth Festival, SAUFEST 5 in December 2010. This was a great honor for BRAC University as it was the first time SAUFEST was held in Bangladesh. A total of 110 student participants from different universities from seven South Asian countries namely NEPAL, BHUTAN, SRILANKA, INDIA, AFGANISTAN, PAKISTAN, MALDIVES along with the host country Bangladesh took part in the festival. The week-long event was held at BRAC University's sprawling Savar campus. 54 volunteers from the university along with 30 teachers and staff managed the successful week-long program. Overall supervision was carried out by Dr. Zainab Faruqi Ali, Director of Student Affairs. The various events were coordinated by Dr. Tureen Afroz and Md. Hafizul Hasan, members of the faculty. The delegates from the seven embassies were present at different sessions. Dr. Dipu Moni, honorable Minister for Foreign



Affairs inaugurated the festival and Abul Kalam Azad, the honorable minister for Information and Cultural Affairs, was present at the closing session. The whole event was covered by the national and private media. The financial support for the festival was obtained from BRAC University, High Commission of India, BRAC Bank, Aarong Milk, Aarong, BRAC Bank, South Asian Foundation, Bashati Builders and NESCAFE. The events included photography exhibition, painting, sketching, sculpture, public speaking, quiz competition, art exhibition, classical, instrumental & light vocal music; folk, classical and modern dance; *Harī Bhanga*, ice and fire shows, Yoga, *pitha utshab*, and a fair complete with Ferris wheel rides, handicraft stalls, *mehedi*, face painting, bioscope, and fireworks. The Slogan of SAUFEST '05 was 'FRIENDSHIP FOREVER'.

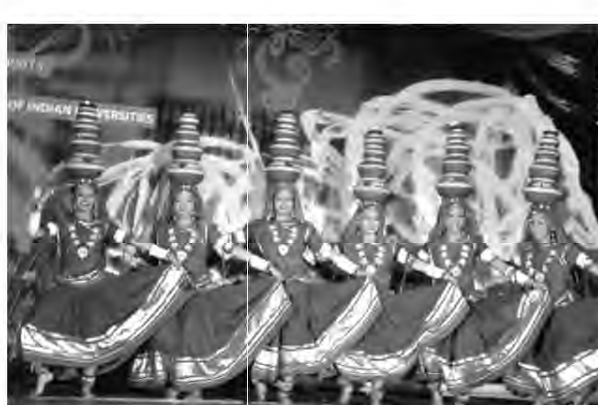

Residential Semester

An Innovative Experiential Learning Initiative of BRACU

The Residential Semester (RS) was the outcome of initial strategic thinking exercises of BRAC University Initiative for Learning and Development (BUILD) which took place during the early development phase of the university. The first RS was organized in the year 2003 (summer semester with 44 students). By 2010 a total of 25 Residential Semesters were organized and a total of 3966 students were graduated from RS. The question on what type of students BRAC University would like to prepare was raised and discussed thoroughly. It was decided that BRAC University would like to see its graduates as competent, enlightened, value driven and responsible citizens of the country. The RS has been designed and incorporated in the process of university curriculum to achieve those objectives. The present section of the report documented the various activities of the Residential Semester for the year 2010 (Spring: 23rd, Summer: 24th and Fall: 25th).

The Residential Semester (RS) at BRAC University has already gained a great reputation and became very popular among the students. It is commonly said that BRACU students attending the Residential Semester cry twice: firstly while going there (as they don't like to leave their families) and secondly while they are coming back from the semester (this time they don't like to leave the campus).

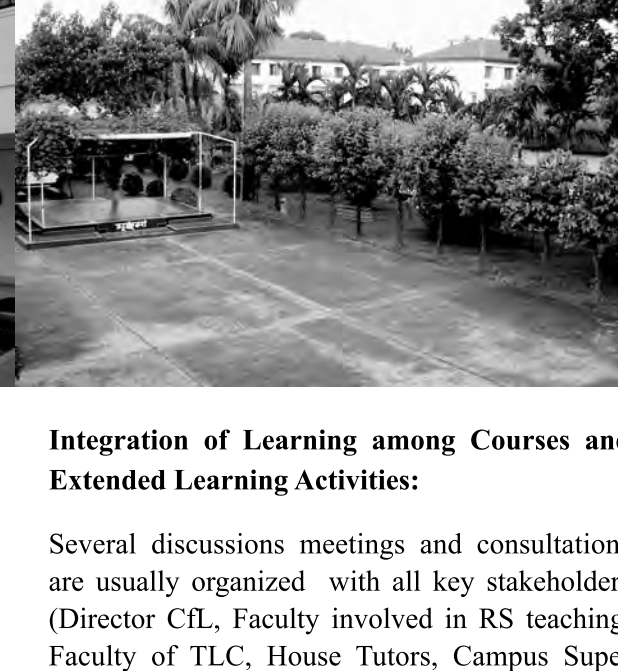
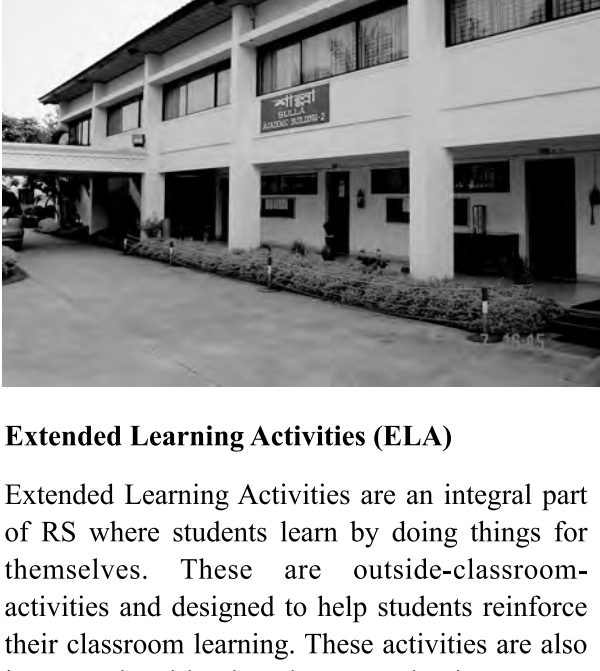
All the students studying in BRACU are required to attend the Residential Semester. However, they do their first semester in the Mohakhali Campus and they need to attend RS at Savar Campus during their second semester. Systematic efforts were taken to design the implementation phase of this semester. This semester has two components: Academic and Extended Learning Activities (ELA). In the academic component only three courses are taught: a) Bangladesh Study, b) Ethics

and Culture, and c) English and in the ELA the students are involved with a significant number of experiential learning activities. The major focus of this semester is to take out the students from their comfort zones of living (many of the students have never been out of their families) and putting them in a challenging situation living at Savar BU Campus where they are required to share and care with their fellow learners. The process has been designed to nurture the potentials of the students in various areas of their interest and to develop their leadership, communication skill, team building skills. "In fact, RS has helped us to rediscover ourselves. We learnt a new meaning of our lives", opined one of the RS graduates. While staying in the campus they are required to use English for communicating with each other both in the classrooms and outside the classroom. This practice helps all of the students to enhance their fluency in English. The course on Bangladesh Study emphasizes making the students realize that they should feel proud of being Bangladeshi. Another compulsory course, Ethics and Culture, prepares our students to be ethically driven both in their way of thinking and behaving.

Objective of the RS:

- Exposing the students in community living and preparing them to be socially responsible persons.
- Nurturing the students to be ethical in their way of thinking and behavior
- Understanding and appreciating the history and culture of Bangladesh.
- Enhancing their communicative English.
- Fostering the creativity and leadership quality of the students.
- Preparing them to be sensitive on cultural diversity.

Integration of Learning among Courses and Extended Learning Activities:

Several discussions meetings and consultations are usually organized with all key stakeholders (Director CIL, Faculty involved in RS teaching, Faculty of TLL, House Tutors, Campus Super and other support staff) before the beginning of each semester to review the course curricula, the number of ELA to be used and the processes of integrating learning among the academic courses and the ELA. Through this special semester, BRACU wants to ensure that every student will become a 'complete being' by bringing a harmony between academic learning and the real life experiences. These activities allow students to actively participate and learn by doing it. Also, individual course and inter course reflection meetings are being held every week, by the teachers to share experiences of various courses and make plan of course integration for the next week. Moreover, individual teachers prepare lesson plans and course materials according to the course objectives and they share their proposed steps and materials for the class and get feedback from others. This process is practiced regularly during the entire semester to maintain unity and integration between course objectives. Cross class visits, another form of integration strategy, helps teachers to understand the scope and process of integration better. Besides, the students need to write a synthesis report on Reflection of Learning on their courses. This process has been introduced to develop the ability of students' critical thinking.

Presentation on Chinese Language & Culture:

Presentations on Chinese Language & Culture were held on January 23 and May 25, 2010 and conducted by Mr. Abdul Rahim & Mr. Qulqong, two Chinese Instructors with CIL. All the students of RS were present in the sessions.

Creating Residential Semester Blog:

Sessions on blogging were held at Markali Hall on May 20 and October 13, 2010 where the usage of blog was discussed in details. The sessions were conducted by Mr. Asif Kamal. Later a Blog for Savar Residential Semester was created for RS students.

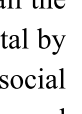
Seminar on Adhishasi:

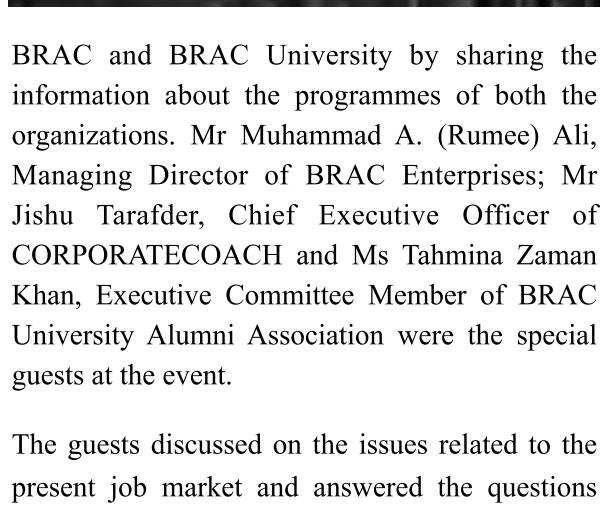

The Beginning of RS Journey: A Day Long Orientation

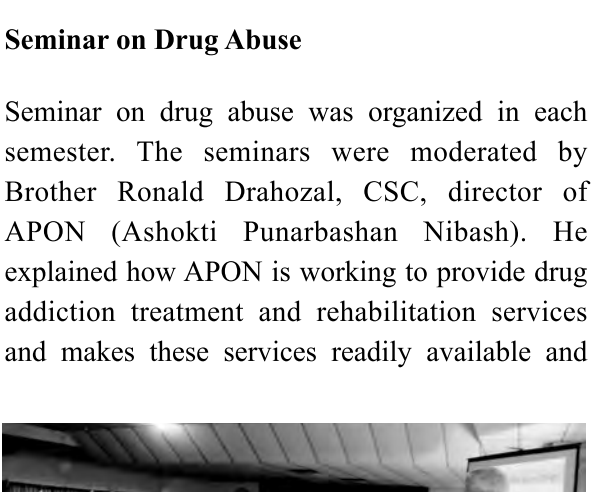
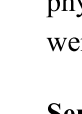

A daylong orientation programme for the newly enrolled students of RS was organized at Markali hall on January 16, May 15 and September 18 for Spring, Summer and Fall Semester of 2010 respectively. The sessions were facilitated by Professors Md. Golam Samdani Fakir, Pro-VC of BRACU and Mahfuzul Bari Chowdhury, Campus Superintendent of Savar Campus, where all the staff and teachers of Savar Campus introduced themselves to the students. Course teachers of three courses of RS (Bangladesh Studies, Ethics and Culture and English) gave short briefings about their courses. In those sessions students worked in groups to make their social capital (norms they need to follow) which they themselves would follow during their stay at Savar Campus. The group works were followed by a plenary sessions for finalizing their list of social capital. The social capital was prepared based on three cardinal principles: a) what they believe, b) which they are going to practice and which they are going to promote. Later on, all the students endorsed the final list of social capital by putting their personal signature on it. The social capital became an integral part of Ethics and Culture course and all the faculty teaching in RS are responsible for effective implementation of this social capital both in the class and outside the class. The application of social capital is monitored based on some well chosen indicators both in the mid term exam and final exam.

Social Learning Lab: A Unique Simulation Exercise on Experiential Learning

Social Learning Lab is one most the powerful experiential learning exercise in which all of the students are involved in different identified days in batches to take over and manage the entire



Savar BRACU campus by themselves. It is a day when most of the laborers and administrative staff enjoy day off and the students take entire responsibility to run the center. In this simulation process all the positions (both managerial and support staff) of the center are replaced (by lottery) by the students and they manage the center for the whole day. In the evening, all of the students, involved in Social Learning Lab, sit together, share their personal learning from this exercise. The very purpose of this exercise is to make the students realize the importance of all kinds of jobs including the jobs that require physical labour. Three Social Learning Lab days were organized in each semester of 2010.

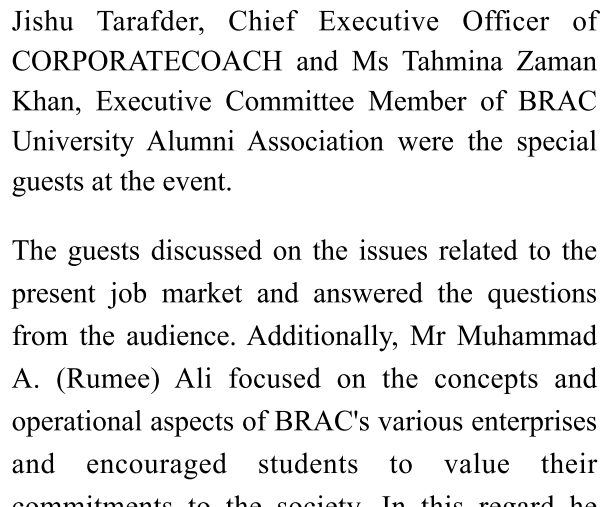
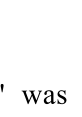
Seminars / Workshops:

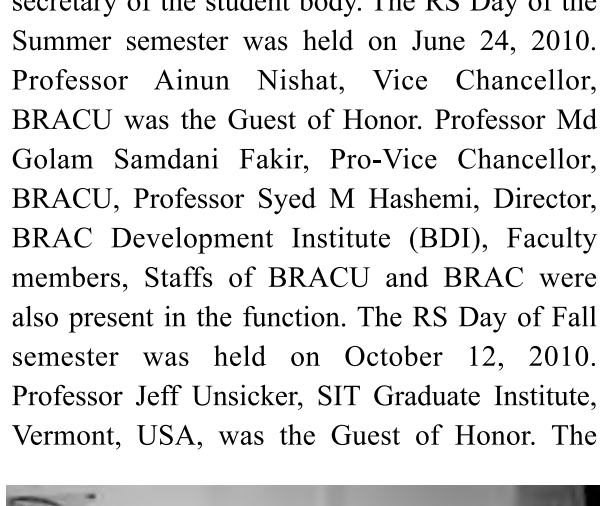
CIL Weekends:

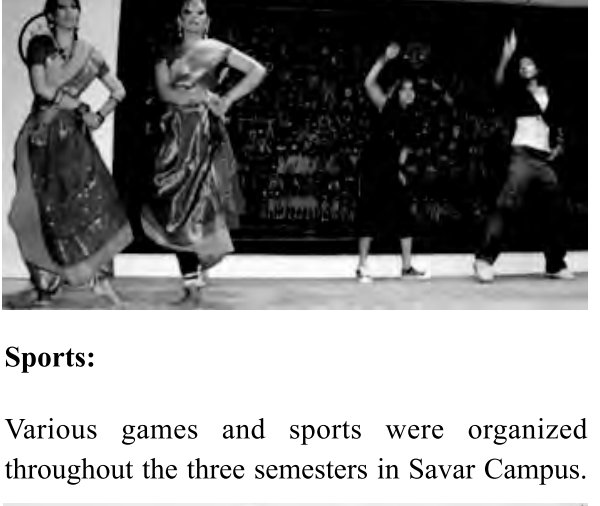
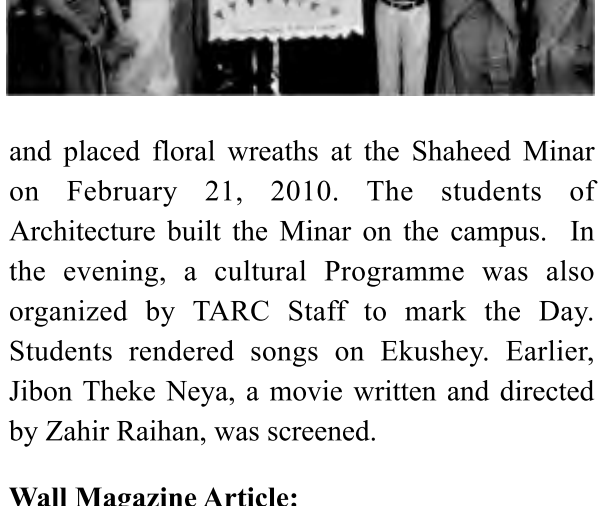
Visits:

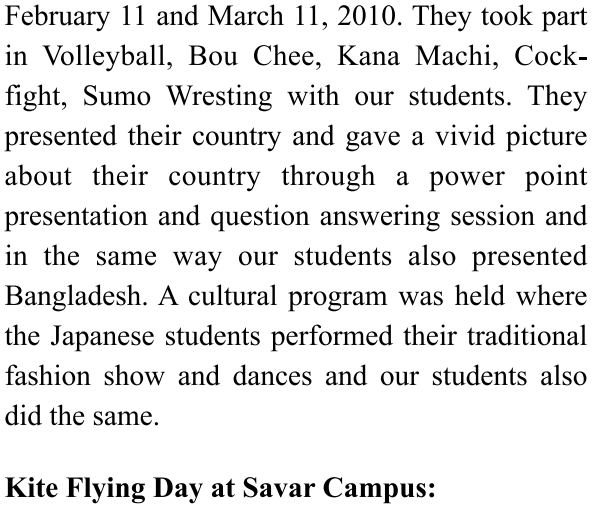
Cultural Programs:

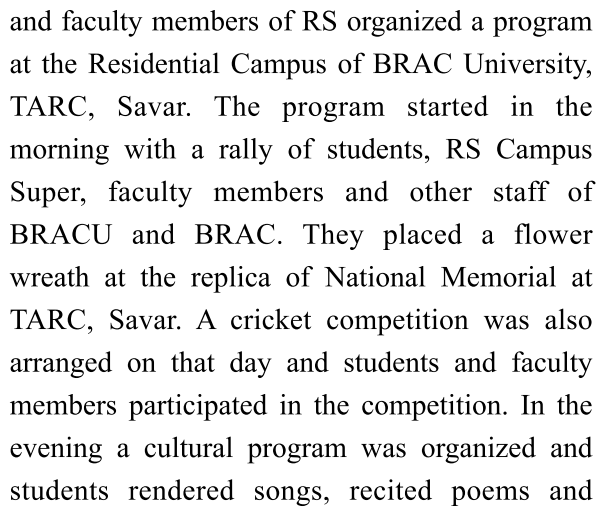
Various games and sports were organized throughout the three semesters in Savar Campus.

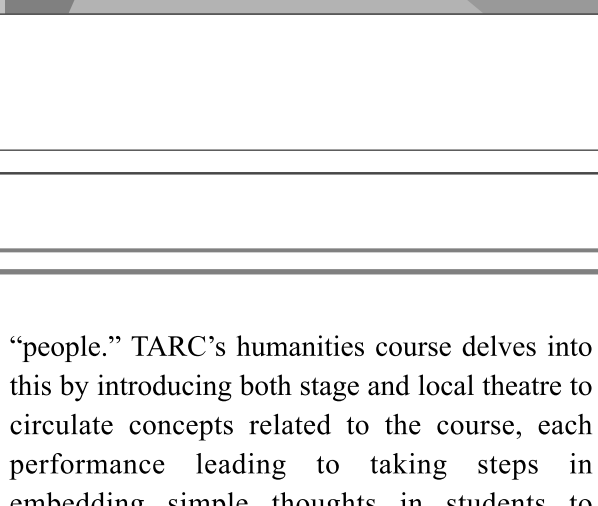
Celebrating BRAC:

Kite Flying Day at Savar Campus:

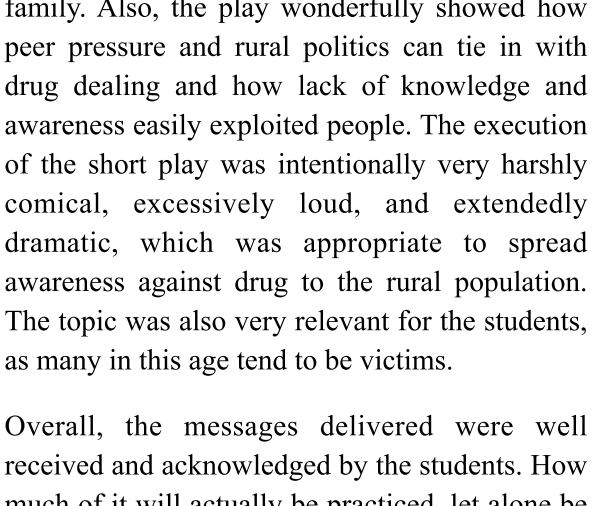

Students had also organized speeches on what the war of liberation meant to them, and a very lively



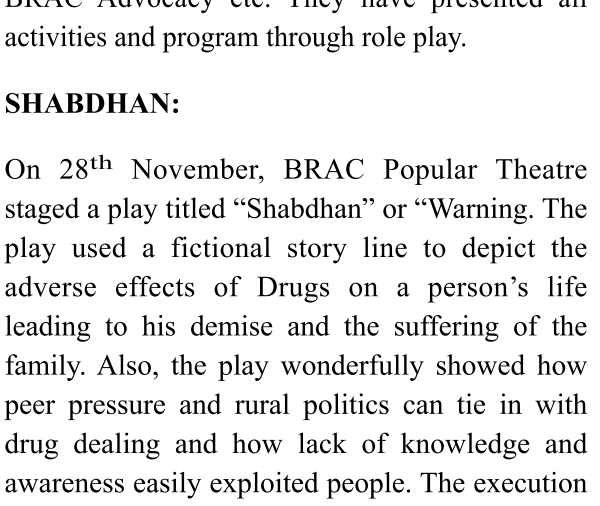
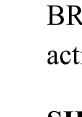
Sir Abed's Documentary:

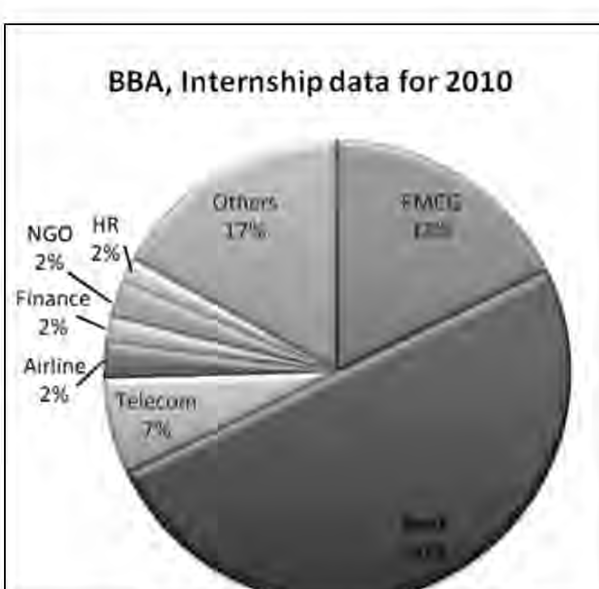


Figure 12: Sector Wise Placement

Job Placement Update, 2010:

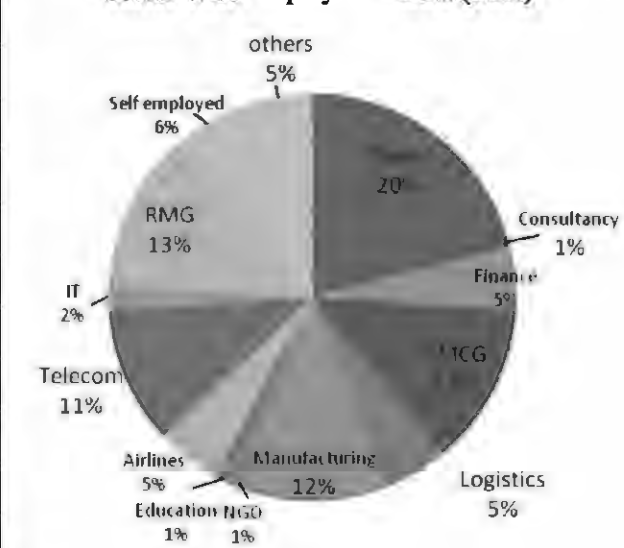

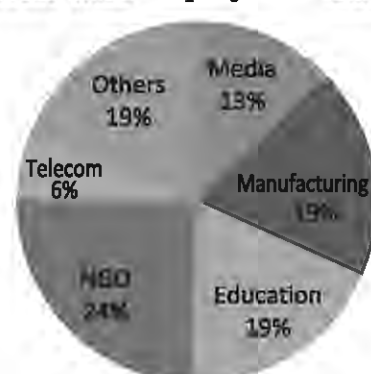

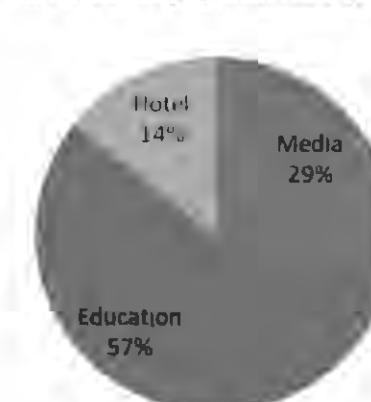

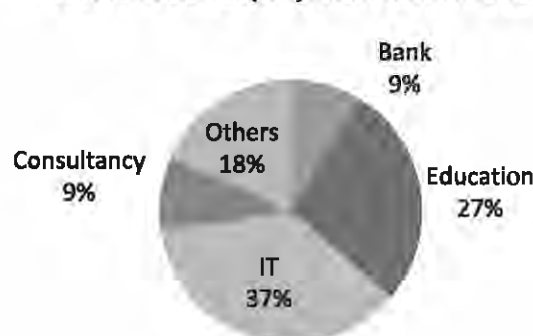

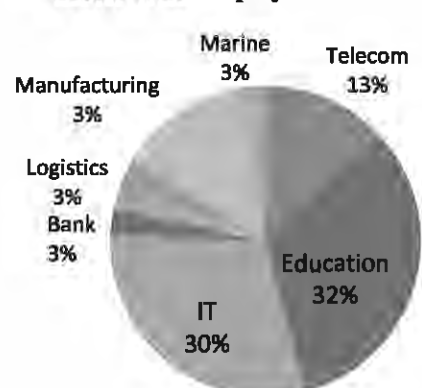

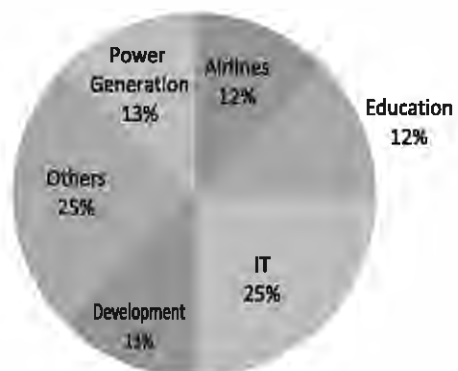


Figure 21: Sector Wise Employment Data (EEE)

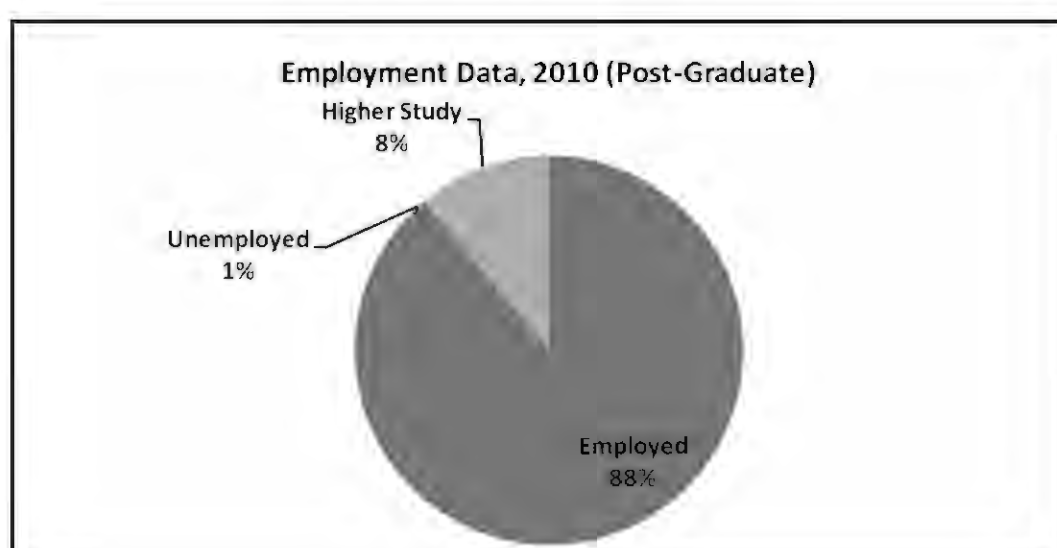


Figure 22: Employment Data (Post-Graduate)

Annual Report on Teaching Learning Center (TLC) BRAC University

Total number of participants' were 360 and the facilitators were Prof. Md. Golam Samdani Fakir, Pro-VC, Ms. Mahbuba Naznin Sani, Sr. Lecturer, Ms. Sabrina Shahidullah, In-Charge, CSO and Ms. Samina Anzum Chowdhury, Lecturer, TLC, BRACU.

4. Consultation Workshops on Best Teaching Practices at BRAC University

Ensuring the quality of teaching for all students has become a major concern for BRAC University. For addressing this concern, BRACU recently facilitated a number of workshops (fully initiated by TLC) with the faculty of different

levels of teaching-experiences at BRACU. The first Consultation Workshop was held on July 12th 2010 with Directors, Chairpersons and Department Heads of different Departments, Centers and Schools of BRACU aimed to share the on-going best teaching practices as well as identifying existing gaps and ways to improve the gaps at BRACU.

On August 5th, 2010, A Follow-up (Second) Consultation Workshop was held with the Directors, Chairpersons and Department Heads again focusing on the outputs, generated on the first Consultation workshop and went for an Action plan.

The third Consultation Workshop held on 22nd of August'2010, followed by the second one, had been designed for the senior and mid-level experienced faculty members of BRACU, selected from respective departments, schools and centers for getting their ideas on the same issue.

The findings of second Consultation workshop (14 issues of concern) were shared in the 62nd Academic Coordination meeting (ACC). Several actions had been taken to address those issues. One of the most significant decisions was taken to develop a Core Facilitation Team (CFT) from different dept., schools, centers, and institutes for the faculty development initiative at BRACU.

5.Day-long Workshops on The Art of Questioning in Creative Teaching at BRAC University

Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) Center

BRAC University is the one and only affiliates of the Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) (<http://www.gdln.org>) in Bangladesh and has been operating since 2006. This centre is coordinated by the World Bank from Washington D.C. The GDLN is a partnership of over 120 recognized global institutions (affiliates) in over 80 countries that collaborate in the design of customized learning solution for individuals and organizations working in development issues. Affiliates are as diverse as the Asian Institute of Management, the Ethiopian Civil Service College, the Islamic Development Bank and Pontificia Universidad Catolica de Peru. The centre for GDLN at BRAC University has its own Video Conferencing Centre. This is located at the 18th floor of University Building and is used to conduct live meetings, corporate affairs, seminars and presentations among people who are geographically apart. Furthermore, it enables virtual tours and participation in global events. Around 40 people can participate at a time

GDLN Activities:

Workshop on The Global Youth Anti-corruption Network

A workshop on "The Global Youth Anti-corruption Network" via Video Conference was held 12 January, 2010. This was the 1st event of the year.

This workshop had connected World Bank HQ, Washington DC with several countries: Bangladesh (BRAC university GDLN Center), Burundi, Colombia, India (New Delhi), Macedonia, Philippines, Sierra Leone, and Zimbabwe

The session had started with introductory remarks of the Youth Services, Governance &

Innovation Practice, World Bank Institute. This was followed by open house discussion, in which ten selected youth organizations forming the core of the Global Youth Anti-Corruption Network had participated to (1) learn about ways to strengthen and expand their network and the role they can each play in that process; (2) learn from each other's experience in fighting corruption and successful case studies of youth action against corruption from around the world; (3) increased their awareness about the role they can play in fighting corruption in their countries.

Dr. Iftekhar Zaman, CEO, Transparency International Bangladesh and a number of youth participated from Bangladesh side.

International Symposium on Cardiac care session: Series 2

The World Heart Foundation has been organizing the International Videoconference on Cardiac Surgery series via Video Conference since December 2008. The series cardiac care session was funded by The VinaCapital Foundation, hosted GDLN Center, Hanoi and the GDLN Center Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam in cooperation with the Cardio Vascular Surgery Association of Vietnam and the Viet Duc Hospital.

The seminar, for series: 2, was scheduled on 2nd Thursday of every other month from 6.00 pm to 9:00 pm at the BRAC University Global Development Learning Network (GDLN). We connected world class cardiac surgeons in the US and Canada to the cardiac surgeons in South East Asia, and beyond via a live videoconference. The cardiac surgeons in Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, Indonesia, and Vietnam had participated at the meeting.



APO e-Learning Program on Information Security Management System: ISO27000:

This course was organized by Asian Productivity Organization (APO) in collaboration with National Productivity Organization (NPO) Bangladesh and the GDLN of the World Bank platform from 19 to 22 April 2010 at BRAC University Video Conference Centre.

The intent of this course was to enable participants to understand the standards, requirements, and application of the Information Security Management System (ISMS) based on ISO27000 standards; and to prepare them to become lead assessors and practitioners for enhancing efficiency and productivity.

Dialog on Civil Service Training Program on Private Sector Development

A two hour video conference for the 2nd Pilot Program of CSTP on PSD was held on 26th April, 2010 from 2:30 to 4:30 pm at BRAC University Center. The video conference was the part of 3 weeks training program organized by the Bangladesh Enterprise Institute (BEI) in partnership with Institute of Governance Studies (IGS), BRAC University and KDI School of Public Policy and Management, South Korea. Seventeen Deputy Secretaries of the GoB have participated this Video Conferencing session.

GDLN Activities: General Meeting, Sri Lanka, 2010

Global Development Learning Network Asia Pacific (GDLN AP) organized its annual general meeting in Sri Lanka, 2010, hosted by the World Bank Colombo office and Distance Learning Center Ltd, Sri Lanka. The meeting took place from 15 -20 Nov, 2010. BRAC University is the only GDLN Affiliated center in Bangladesh and Mr. Ishfaq Ilahi Choudhury the Registrar, attended in that GDLN AP regional general meeting. More than 40 representatives from South Asia, East Asia and the Pacific gathered in Colombo, Sri Lanka to discuss how the region could boost its provision of knowledge exchange and capacity building

Distance Learning Course on the Microfinance Training of the Trainers (MFTOT)

The Seventh delivery of the Microfinance Training of Trainers course (MFTOT-7) started on Dec 9 and will continue till April 2010.

Microfinance is recognized as an effective development interaction that enhances access to financial services by low income individuals. While there is great demand for microfinance services the main constraint is not a lack of funds but a lack of capacity in operating a sustainable institution. To address this problem, the ADBI, TDLC which is a member of GDLN Asia Pacific

and the United Nations Capital Development Fund (UNCDF) launched the MFToT program in 2005.

The interactive microfinance distance learning course (MFDL) developed by UNCDF was the core learning material for study. Four (4) Interactive Video Conference took place in 4 months at BRAC University Premises along with online tutoring, e-discussion and online exams. Submission of assignments and receiving online tutoring were helped participants to master the knowledge of best practice of microfinance.

Sites connected for the session were Afghanistan, Bangladesh, France, Japan, Mongolia, Nepal, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, and Sri Lanka GDLN Centers.



This series began as a capacity building effort for the fine cardiac surgeons in Vietnam. It has grown into a world wide effort with participants in Vietnam, China, India, Bangladesh, several countries in Africa, Israel, Ireland and the US.

The Singapore Experience – Ingredients for successful Nationwide e-Transformation

A day long event was held on Wednesday, 3 February, 2010. Countries participating via videoconferencing were: Bhutan, Nepal, Pakistan, and Sri Lanka.

The workshop shared the role of ICT in the public sector transformation agenda and Singapore's success in eGovernment via close collaboration with the private sector. Experts from Singapore Government CIO Office and leading Singapore ICT companies, namely, IDA International, Crimson Logic, NCS, novaCITYNETS and Equaria shared highlights about Singapore's 30 years of eGovernment journey.

Ms. Ellen Goldstein; Country Director, World Bank Bangladesh, Ambassador Verghese Mathews Singapore High Commissioner to Bangladesh, and Mr. A.K.M. Abdul Awal Mazumder, Secretary, Ministry of Science and ICT were present in the opening session of this workshop.

Climate and Disaster Resilience Initiative (CDRI) for Asian Cities

Tokyo Distance Learning Center coordinated a new program, called "Climate and Cities Resilience initiative (CDRI) for Asian cities". This course was designed with blended-learning including four Video Conferencing sessions from Feb 2010 to April 2010. The duration of each session was 3 hours. This initiative was taken because climate and disaster related risks were increasing in Asia. CDRI was initiated in 2008 by various partners, taking a developmental approach to reducing climate related disaster risks.

Participants were from City governments, urban ministries from CITYNET member cities and

their respective countries. The Cities connected by Video conference were Chennai (India), Colombo (Sri Lanka), Dhaka (Bangladesh), Hue (Vietnam), Kuala Lumpur (Malaysia), Makati (Philippines), Sukabumi (Indonesia), Suwon (Korea), Kyoto (Japan). There were six participants from Dhaka City Corporation.

APO e-Learning on Knowledge Management Concept

This course was organized by Asian Productivity Organization (APO) in collaboration with National Productivity Organization (NPO) Bangladesh and the GDLN of the World Bank platform from 2 to 5 March 2010 at BRAC University Video Conference Centre.

The main faculty comprising three resource speakers delivered presentations from their own countries. In each phase of the course, there were five country groups of 20 participants each. Each of the country groups were moderated by a country project coordinator in each GDLN center. The presentations of resource speakers were interactive, each group of participants made presentations to share their experience.

A multi-country two-hour video conference on South Asia Regional Collaboration On IT Enabled Services.

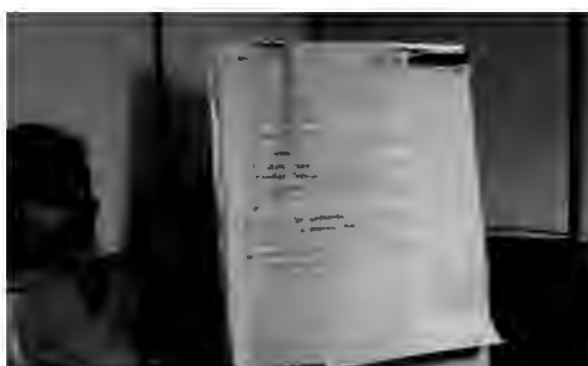

APO e-Learning Program on Total Quality Management (TQM) for the Service Industry

This course was organized By Asian Productivity Organization (APO) in collaboration with National Productivity Organization (NPO) Bangladesh and the Global Development Learning Network (GDLN) of the World Bank platform on 4-7 Oct 2010 at BRAC University Video Conference Centre.

In today's world, organizations are facing growing challenges from global competition and the needs of increasingly sophisticated customers. Sensing the need to improve the product or service quality, most organizations are applying various improvement methods in the hope of achieving the required growth and also greater profit.

One of the methods deemed necessary to improve the product or service quality in organizations is through the implementation of Total Quality Management (TQM). TQM which has shown great success in manufacturing companies is now being rapidly adapted to service organizations, due to the nature of service industries in terms of its customer orientation.



Ayesha Abed Library

In 2010 BRAC University Ayesha Abed Library continued to make progress towards the realization of the key strategies designed to improve support for the University's learning, teaching and research activities. The library has developed and improved its core services and products this year. In 2010, 2059 books added to the main collection through purchasing. The library was able to extend the range and depth of the collection through the subscribing to thousands of e-journals and databases via PERI under the Bangladesh INASP PERI consortium program. Library has also subscription of a number of other databases such as JSTOR, eGranary, AGORA, HINARI, OARE.

Several initiatives were taken throughout this year. The main objective of these initiatives was to develop our library a 21st Century world-class Knowledge Resource Centre and provide innovative services and collections to the teaching, learning and research communities.

The library conducted 51 Information literacy classes for 1255 students and faculties. The main purpose of the sessions was to acquaint students and faculties with the information sources, resources and techniques to retrieve resources as per their needs. The library staff attended several training and workshop in order to improve their professional and technical skills.

Project Implemented in 2010

This year BRACU Library has successfully implemented a project entitled "Implementing next generation Open Source Discovery tool VuFind at BRAC University Libraries", (<http://library.bracu.ac.bd/vufind/>) funded by INASP, UK. VuFind is open source software

which was selected as the preferred Search and Discovery interface for BRAC University Libraries. The project duration was May 2010 to January 2011.

Objective of the Project

The main objective of this project was to better integrate all of the library's resources and to provide a clean, consistent interface for the users. Other specific objectives are:

- ♦ To access and discover information in a robust, distributed digital environment through an open source federate tool
- ♦ To enable users to search and browse through all library resources (Catalogue, Institutional Repository and other database and e-journals.)
- ♦ To improve the ability to parse, contextualize, and interpret search results through better interface design
- ♦ To provide a clean, consistent and single interface
- ♦ To increase access to library resources
- ♦ To eliminates need to repeat same search multiple times
- ♦ To reduce time needed to find information

Project Outcomes

- ♦ Intuitive searching across many collections in the BRACU Library. BRAC University has successfully integrated Koha (12,000), Dspace (629) and e-journals (46,158) with VuFind Discovery tool.



- ♦ BRAC University is the first university who has integrated KOHA and Dspace with VuFind and has build a Koha- VuFind Driver which is available at current development trunk <https://vufind.svn.sourceforge.net/svnroot/vufind/trunk/web/Drivers/Koha.php>
- ♦ VuFind enables BRACU to meet the needs of its users in terms of improved experience, and better search functionality. It will improve client satisfaction.
- ♦ The addition of faceted search filtering by author, topic or format, signposting to alternative editions, tagging, personal listing and a variety of output options, will all increase the ability of our users to find and utilize library resources, and help promote our digital collections.
- ♦ Enhanced Web 2.0 functionality. Now users can tag records, leave comments, add to favorites RSS feeds.
- ♦ The success of this project is that other universities including the INASP PERI Consortium institutes across the country can also implement and similarly enjoy the benefits of this discovery tool.
- ♦ The University has also build expertise in the implementation of the software and is now in a position to offer both implementation consultancy and software support services to other institutions
- ♦ Step by step documentation of VuFind installation, customization, integration with KOHA and Dspace has been prepared.
- ♦ Any institute which is considering implementation VuFind, or another open-source discovery platform, is likely to benefit from the experiences of this discovery tool project.
- ♦ Data quality has been Improved
