## I. Rationale:

This course is tailored for using French at elementary level of proficiency for effective communication in everyday life and different situations. As per modern pedagogy, emphasis given on a function based communicative approach in order to facilitate four skills (listening, reading, writing \& speaking). Students develop their vocabulary, grammar, structural accuracy, pronunciation, oral fluency and overall acquisition through different activities, exercises and audio-visual support.

## II. Outcomes:

After successful completion of the course, the participants are expected to maintain social contact in different social situations, greet people, using French expressions for day-to-day life. This course will help them to ask information about a person (name, age, nationality, profession, address, telephone number etc) and to talk about their likings and preferences. Students will know how to write letters to francophone friends and understand by listening French used in different social \& daily situation.
Moreover, it will help them to read and understand texts at a reasonably beginners level and will be able to write effectively (e-mail, descriptive letter, completing different forms etc). Most importantly, this course will help the students to speak with moderate pronunciation and accuracy respecting social language

## III. Format and Procedures:

There will be two quizzes among which best one will be considered. Similarly students will make a presentation in French language. Moreover, they will make a project (video) in a group. Apart from these students will face one midterm and the final exam during the semester.

## IV. My advice to students:

Regular attendance in the class is very important as you are the beginners for this course and it is a new language on which you have no idea. From my previous experience it is seen that students who are regular have the better chance to do well in this course. Taking class notes in the separate copy (only for FRN 101) is highly recommended.
