We are delighted to invite you to the fourth Speakers' Forum titled "Faith and Education: Contestations around the Madrasa in Bangladesh" on March 12th, 2016. The Forum is a joint initiative between Georgetown University's Berkley Center for Religion, Peace and World Affairs, World Faiths Development Dialogue, and Department of Economics and Social Sciences, BRAC University.
